# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

100 AUG - 3RESEDENTIAL CARPENTRY PROGRAM, INC.

to Idaho Code Section 30-3-16, hereby forms the following nonprofit corporation, which shall be controlled by and have the powers enumerated in the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act.

#### ARTICLE 1

The name of the corporation is Residential Carpentry Program, Inc.

#### ARTICLE 2

The period of its duration is perpetual.

# ARTICLE 3

The corporation is organized and will be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and its primary purpose shall be to organize and supervise high school students in Lake Pend Oreille School District #84 in planning for and construction of a residential structure for sale or raffle to the general public.

#### ARTICLE 4

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation

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for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 3 above.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

### ARTICLE 5

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state

or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

### ARTICLE 6

The corporation shall have members under rules set forth in its bylaws.

### ARTICLE 7

The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 101 North 4th Avenue [mailing address: P.O. Box 814], Sandpoint, ID 83864, and the registered agent at such address is Charlton Mills.

# ARTICLE 8

All corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of, and the affairs of the corporation managed under the direction of, its board of directors.
