KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, the undersigned, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and do hereby certify:

That the name of said corporation is the Snake River Valley Sugar Company, Limited.

That the purposes for which it is formed are to produce, manufacture, refine, buy, sell, and deal in sugars and syrups; to contract, buy, sell, lease, mortgage, and operate sugar ^{and Canning} factories, and to carry on all industries incident to the operation of sugar ^{and Canning} factories; to buy, sell, own, contract, lease, and mortgage real estate; to deal in live stock; own shares of stock in other corporations; buy, sell, lease, and otherwise acquire and dispose of water and water rights, reservoirs, canals, ditches, etc.; generate electricity and operate an electric plant, operate electric or steam railroads, build, construct, maintain, and operate a pipe line or pipe lines within the limits of the Counties of Bingham and Fremont, and engage in business, manufacturing, and mercantile pursuits.

That the place where its principal business is to be transacted shall be the Town of Blackfoot, in Bingham County, State of Idaho.

That the term for which it is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after its incorporation.

ARTICLE V.

That the capital stock of said corporation is one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and shall be divided into one hundred thousand (100,000) shares of the par value of ten dollars (\$10.00) per share.

ARTICLE VI.

That the number of directors of said corporation shall be five (5), and the names and residences of those who are appointed for the first year are: D. W. Standred, Pocatello, Bannock County, Idaho; D. H. Biethan, Blackfoot, Bingham County, Idaho; W. B. Eldredge, Blackfoot, Bingham County, Idaho; W. D. Trego, Blackfoot, Bingham County, Idaho; H. B. Nielsen, Blackfoot, Bingham County, Idaho.

ARTICLE VII.

That the amount of the capital stock which has actually been subscribed is five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), which consists of five hundred (500) shares of said capital stock, and the following are the names of the persons by whom the same is subscribed: D. W. Standred, one hundred (100) shares, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00); D. H. Biethan, one hundred (100) shares, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00); W. B. Eldredge, one hundred (100) shares, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00); W. D. Trego, one hundred (100) shares, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00); H. B. Nielsen, one hundred (100) shares, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

ARTICLE VIII.

That the Board of Directors shall have power to make such prudential by-laws as they shall deem proper for the management of said company, not inconsistent with the laws of the state, for the purpose of carrying on all kinds of business within the objects and purposes of this company; that the principal property of the company will be located in Bingham County, Idaho.

ARTICLE V.

That the capital stock of said corporation is one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and shall be divided into one hundred thousand (100,000) shares of the par value of ten dollars (\$10.00) per share.

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ARTICLE VIII.

That the Board of Directors shall have power to make such prudential by-laws as they shall deem proper for the management of said company, not inconsistent with the laws of the state, for the purpose of carrying on all kinds of business within the objects and purposes of this company; that the principal property of the company will be located in Bingham County, Idaho.

ARTICLE IX.

That the stock of this corporation is fully paid up and non-assessable, and the same is and shall remain non-assessable, and said stock shall be subject neither to assessment nor call, and the liability of the stockholders is and shall be limited as provided by the laws of the State of Idaho.
