ORDINANCE NO. 148

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF KAMIAH AT THEIR REGULAR MEETING ON THE 7TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1957, DISCONTINUING THE OPERATION AS A VILLAGE AND ORGANIZING AS A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS; CHANGING NAME FROM VILLAGE OF KAMIAH TO CITY OF KAMIAH; ADOPTING SEAL; SETTING DATE FOR CHANGE TO TAKE EFFECT.

THE VILLAGE OF KAMIAH, IDAHO, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: The following resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Kamiah, Idaho, on the 7th day of January, 1957.

That whereas a petition was filed with the Board of Trustees of the Village of Kamiah, Idaho, on the 4th day of June, 1956, as provided by section 50-30c Idaho Code as amended, asking that said Village be organized as a city; that said petition contained the names and signatures of 238 persons of whom 182 were qualified electors; that 182 qualified electors were more than 3/5ths of the qualified electors voting at the last general Village election which was 276 voters;

That said petition was duly examined by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Kamiah, Idaho, at their regular meeting held on the 4th day of June, 1956; that said petition was found to be proper in all respects and that said Board ordered an election thereon to be held in said village on the 10th day of July, 1956; that on the 10th day of July, 1956, such election was held in the Village of Kamiah and the results from said election were duly canvassed by the Board of Trustees of said Village on the 6th day of August, 1956, showing the result that there were 69 votes cast at said election, those in favor of the petition were 64 and those voting against said petition were 5; that it was determined thereby that said petition to change the village organization in the Village of Kamiah, Idaho, to that of a city of the second class, to be known as the City of Kamiah, Idaho, was duly approved.

That the changeover from the village organization to that of a city of the second class is to be done at the time for the next regular municipal election to be held on the fourth Tuesday of April, 1957;

That the seal of the said City of Kamiah, Idaho, is to be as follows: The seal shall be circular in form and the word, "SEAL" to be printed across the same through the center thereof and printed in a circular form around the outer portion of said seal are the words, "City of Kamiah, Lewis County, Idaho";

That the Board of Trustees at the same time ascertained that the population of the Village of Kamiah exceeds the sum of 125 inhabitants and the official census of said Village is the number 1239 persons;

This ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after its passage, approval, publication and posting.

Hodge, County attorney of Nez Perce County, Idaho, immediately commence condemnation proceedings in the District Court to condemn the necessary land for the right of way for the above named road across the following lands:-

In the matter of the petition of A. C. Nitsen et al for the laying out of a new road in road districts No. 14, 57 and 58 as amended by the addition of these words: "The owners of land who refuse to give right of way, or consent thereto, refuse to sign this blank, or one just like it, stating they refused." It appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the petition is accompanied by a good and sufficient bond, which bond is hereby approved, it is ordered that E. D. Briggs, F. C. Hicks and Martin Minert, be and they are hereby appointed viewers to view out and survey said road, and to meet said E. D. Briggs, County Surveyor, at the point of beginning at such time as he may designate, and make due report to this Board.

On Page 150, Vol. J. Comms. Record. October 1909 Session.

In the matter of the viewers report on the petition of R. L. Bowles et al for a road in road district No. 51. It appearing that the viewers duly qualified according to law; that they filed with this Board their report and same is approved; and it further appearing that the land owners along said road have granted the right of way and consent to the opening of said road, except Leo. W. H. Miller, who is awarded by the viewers the sum of \$50.00 for damages in fencing, and the following Indians are also granted fencing for damages: En see Weirt, Allotment No. 810; At Lal tul Kar nin, Allotment No. 932; Tan Yan pat, Allotment 933; Ca tal do, Allotment No. 935; Red Heart, Allotment No. 485; Andrew Red Heart, Allotment 487. It is hereby ordered that a hearing will be had on Saturday, January 15th 1910 at 2 o'clock P. M. of said day on the above described petition and viewers report, and the Clerk of this Board is hereby instructed to notify the said Leo. W. H. Miller of said hearing and the said Clerk is also hereby instructed to make application to the Department of the Interior at Washington D. C. for their approval of the right of way survey of the above named Indian lands. It is further ordered that the Auditor draw a warrant on the General Road Fund in favor of Leo. W. H. Miller for the sum of \$50.00 as damages for fencing, and to be tendered to the said Leo. W. H. Miller, by J. L. Harris, the road is under of road district No. 51.

On Page 155, Vol. J. Comms. Record. October 1909 Session.

In the matter of the petition of M. E. Ransom et al for the incorporation of the village of Kamiah, following order is made, to-wit:- Whereas, On the 11th day of October, 1909 there was filed with the Clerk of this Board a petition requesting that the Village of Kamiah be incorporated as a village under the laws of the State of Idaho; and Whereas, a protest to the granting of said petition was filed with the Clerk of the Board, the Board set Tuesday the 19th day of October, 1909, as a day for the hearing of said petition and protest.

Now on this 19th day of October, 1909, this matter came on for hearing before the Board, the petitioners and protestants being both represented at said hearing. The Board after reading the petition and protest and listening to the oral evidence produced and the arguments thereon finds as follows:

That the said petition contains the names of, and has been signed by, more than a majority of the taxable inhabitants actually residing within the boundaries of the proposed village.

That there are more than two hundred actual residents residing within the boundaries of the proposed Village as described in said petition. That said petitioners are entitled to have the said Village incorporated as prayed for in the petition.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that the said Village of Kamiah be and the same is hereby incorporated under the name and style of the Village of Kamiah. That henceforth the same be a political corporation with all the powers, rights and privileges of incorporated towns and villages, as is contemplated in such cases especially provided by the laws of the State of Idaho. That the boundaries of said Village shall be as follows:-

Commencing at the northwest corner of section one (1) Township thirty-three (33), North of Range three (3) East of Boise Meridian; thence South on the section line between section one (1) and Two (2) in the same range a distance of one mile; thence south on the section line between section Twelve (12) and Section (11) to where the said section line crosses the Lawyers creek; thence down the middle of the channel of said Creek to where the same empties into the Clearwater River; Thence down the said Clearwater river to a point where the section line of section one (1) above said Township and Range afore said crosses the said Clearwater River; thence west on said section line to the place of beginning.

It is further ordered that D. A. Smith, J. F. Pomeroy, J. F. Bridgwell, W. B. Renschaw and A. Girardelly, residents and inhabitants within the corporate boundaries of said Village and qualified to act as such be and they are hereby appointed to act as trustees for the said Village of Kamiah, until their successors are elected and qualified as provided by law.

Done in open session of the Board of County Commissioners of Nez Perce County, State of Idaho, in regular session at Lewiston this 19th day of October, 1909.
