CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION WEARYRICK DITCH COMPANY

We, the undersigned, hereby certify, that we are President and Secretary respectively of the Wearyrick Ditch Company, and presided at a Special Meeting of the Stockholders of Wearyrick Ditch Company, held at the Riverside L.D.S. Church in Riverside, Bingham County, Idaho, on the 28th day of November, 1952, at 2:00 o'clock P.M. of said day; that by unanimous vote of the members attending such meeting, the following amendment of the Articles of Incorporation was duly adopted, to-wit:

- " RESOLVED, that Article II of the Articles of Incorporation of Wearyrick Ditch Company be amended to read as follows:
- "That the purposes for which this company is formed are as follows:
- "A. To acquire with its capital stock, or otherwise, and to own, hold, sell, lease, convey, pledge, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal in, water rights, ditches, canals, pumping plants, rights of way, diversion dams and all manner of real or personal property used in connection therewith.
- "B. To borrow money and to pledge, mortgage or otherwise encumber any and all property, both real and personal, to secure the same.
- "C. To do any and every lawful thing permitted by the laws of the State of Idaho to a canal and irrigation company, and wich are not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Article IV of the Articles of Incorporation of this Company be amended to read as follows: "The corporation is to have perpetual existence".

That notice of the intention to amend the Articles of Incorporation was given by publication at least once a week for four weeks in the Blackfoot Bulletin, a newspaper published in Bingham County, Idaho, the same being the County wherein such meeting was held; that said notice complied with the provisions of paragraph 6, Section 42-2401, Idaho Code, and did state the time and place at which the vote of said amendment of Articles of Incorporation would be taken, and did contain a summary of the proposed changes in the Articles of Incorporation.
