# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

#### SPENCER'S INC.

### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, being natural citizens of full age and citizens of the United States of America, in order to form a corporation, for the purposes hereinafter stated, under and pursuant to the provisions of the general laws of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify as follows:

## ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be "SPENCER'S INC.".

# ARTICLE II

The purposes of the corporation are:

- (1) To engage generally in the wholesale and retail business of office supplies and stationery and to do and engage in all activities directly and indirectly for said purpose, including, but not limited to, dealing in furnishings, machines, fountain pens, pencils, crayons, inks, writers' supplies, artists' supplies, novelties, books of all kinds, either printed or blank, and such other items generally associated with an office supply business.
- (2) To do printing, stamping, engraving, lithographing, stereotyping, electrotyping, book binding, and publishing of all kinds.
- (3) To design, print, or otherwise make, buy, and sell, printed forms for legal, commercial, and other instruments, calling cards, correspondence cards, business cards, invitations, announcements, holiday cards, souvenir post cards, calendars, valentines, favors, programs and art stationery of every kind.
- (4) To manufacture, purchase, and sell writing papers, envelopes, blotting papers, book papers, tissue papers, and cards

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and paper of every kind and for all purposes.

- (5) To purchase, improve, develop, lease, exchange, sell, dispose of or otherwise deal in real estate and personal property for the purpose of the corporation, and to purchase, lease, build, construct, erect, occupy; and manage buildings of every kind and character; to finance and purchase, improve and develop, construct any land and buildings belonging to or acquired by the corporation or any other person, firm or corporation.
- (6) To act as a partner or in a joint venture in any transaction.
- (7) To have and exercise all rights and powers from time to time granted to the corporation by the statutes of the State of Idaho, or such other place or places and states as the corporation may from time to time conduct its business.
- (8) To repair and service machines of all types used in offices.

# ARTICLE III

The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

# ARTICLE IV

The location of the principal office of the corporation is 1340 Overland Avenue, Burley, County of Cassia, State of Idaho, and the post office address of the corporation is Box 479, Burley, Idaho.

# ARTICLE V

The total number of shares which the corporation is authorized to issue is 250 shares, all of which shall be without par value. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, fix the consideration for which said shares, without par value, shall be issued and sold and when said shares are issued and sold, they shall be fully paid and non-assessable.

# ARTICLE VI

At all meetings of the shareholders every stockholder of

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record shall be entitled to one vote for every share of stock standing in his or her name on the books of the corporation. In the election of directors, every shareholder of record, calculating the number of votes to which he or she may be entitled, shall have the right to multiply the number of his or her shares by the number of directors to be elected and he or she may cast all such votes for any one candidate or may distribute them among two or more candidates.

### ARTICLE VII

# ARTICLE VIII

The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three nor more than five directors. During the term of office, or thereafter, the number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time as provided by the By-Laws, provided, however, that the number of directors constituting the board shall never be less than three nor more than five.

#### ARTICLE IX

The power to make, repeal, and amend the By-Laws, adopt new By-Laws, is hereby conferred upon the Directors as well as upon the shareholders.

# ARTICLE X

The corporation may from time to time provide and carry out and recall, abolish, revise, amend, alter, or change, a plan or plans for the participation by all or any of the employees, including directors and officers of this corporation or of any corporation in which or in the welfare of which the corporation

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has any interest, and those actively engaged in the conduct of this corporation's business, in the profits of this corporation or of any branch or division thereof, as part of this corporations legitimate expenses, and for the furnishing to such employees and persons or any of them, at this corporation's expense, of medical services, insurance against accident, sickness or death, pensions during old age, disability or unemployment, education, housing, social services, recreation, or other similar aids for their relief or general welfare, in such manner and upon such terms and conditions, as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE XI

No contract or other transaction between the corporation or any other corporation and no action of the corporation shall in any way be affected or invalidated by the fact that any of the directors of the corporation are pecuniarily or otherwise interested in or are directors or officers of such other corporation. Any director individually may be a party to or may be pecuniarily or otherwise interested in any contract or transaction of this corporation and any director of the corporation who is so interested may be counted in determining the existence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors of the corporation which shall authorize such contract or transaction and may vote thereon to authorize the transaction or contract with the same right, force, and effect as if he were such director or officer of this corporation or such other corporation and not so interested therein.
