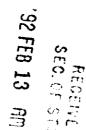

Articles of Incorporation of The Palouse Arts Council, Inc. A Not-for-Profit Corporation



We, the undersigned natural persons of eighteen years or more, asting as incorporators for the purpose of of creating a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho do hereby set forth:

- 1. The name of the corporation shall be The Palouse Arts Council, Inc.
- 2. The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.
- 3. The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

To foster, promote and increase the public knowledge and appreciation of the arts, exclusively by educational activities, by encouraging, facilitating, and sponsoring performances, exhibitions, classes, and other public art activity primarily in Latah County, Idaho, and Whitman County Washington, and undertaking such other programs and services such as planning, research, and fundraising as are deemed necessary to encourage participation of the arts by all citizens of the Idaho and Washington area.

- 4. The corporation is to have the following class of members:

- 9. In addition to the powers granted corporations under the laws of the State of Idaho, the corporation shall have full power and authority to make distributions, in keeping with corporate purposes to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.
- 10. It is provided that no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes herein set forth.

A substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office (including the publishing or distribution of statements).

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation,

contributions to which are deductible under section 170(2) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

It is further provided that upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purpose of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
