

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF CUSTER LODGE NO. 21, I. O. O. F.,
Challis,
OF CHALLIS, IDAHO.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That on the Twenty-fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the Members of Custer Lodge No. 21, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, of Challis, Idaho, and acting under and by authority of a Charter dated the 12th day of October A. D. 1887, and duly issued by the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, of Idaho, (a corporation) pursuant to a call made, did regularly meet in their Lodge-room in Challis, Idaho, a quorum being present, and George E. Keyes, Noble Grand and J. G. Fennell, Secretary, acting Judges of said meeting, and by over a two-thirds vote of the members present did order;

First: That the Members of said Custer Lodge No. 21, I. O. O. F. have this day voluntarily associated themselves together for the forming of a social, charitable, and benevolent Corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and the laws of the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of Idaho, (a corporation)

Second: That the name of said Corporation is Custer Lodge No. 21, Independent Order of Odd Fellows;

Third: That the purpose for which said Corporation is formed is for social, charitable, and benevolent purposes;

Fourth: That the place of holding meetings and where business is to be transacted is at Challis, Custer County, Idaho;

Fifth: That the term for which said Corporation is to exist is for the time allowed by the laws of Idaho;

Sixth: The number of Trustees of said Corporation shall be three (3)

Seventh: That we, George E. Keyes, Noble Grand, and J. G. Fennell Secretary, were the Judges of said Meeting and Election held by said Custer Lodge No. 21, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, (a corporation on said 24th day of September, A. D. 1898, and for the purpose of the election of Trustees, and then and there, a quorum being present, Thomas J. Paul, Hugh C. McKendrick and M. M. Sweet, were elected by over a majority of the votes of the members present as a Board of Trustees of said Custer Lodge No. 21, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, (a corporation) of Challis, Idaho, and the said members of said Lodge did by over a majority vote of the members present then and there decide that said Thomas J. Paul, Hugh C. McKendrick, and M. M. Sweet and their successors should forever hereafter be called and known by the name of the Board of Trustees of Custer Lodge No. 21, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, (a corporation) of Challis, Custer County, Idaho

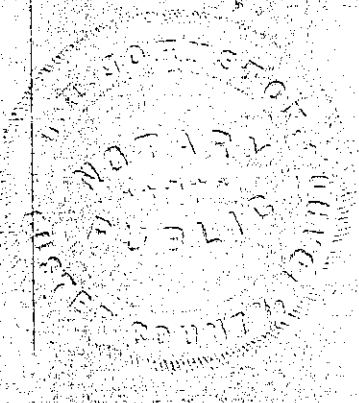
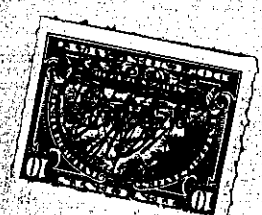

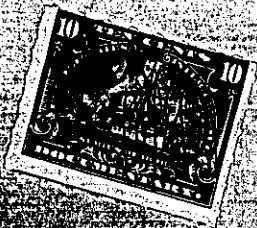
