Articles of Incorporation

Marsing Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc.

Attachment for Article 2 and Article 8 and Article 9

Article 2: The corporation is organized to promote social welfare within the meaning of section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code, including but not limited to: (1) helping fund youth athletic programs and organizations within the Marsing community, (2) supporting other local charitable and civic organizations for the benefit of Marsing area citizens, (3) promoting, providing or supporting educational activities in the area of fire prevention and disaster preparedness, (4) providing financial support to individuals and families coping with a home fire or other natural disaster, and (5) providing for the general welfare of the Marsing community and reducing the burden of government by maintaining a viable cadre of volunteer firemen through limited financial assistance in times of need for expenses such as medical costs in case of injury or illness to a volunteer fireman or their immediate family.

Article 8: Upon dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding sections of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principle office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Article 9: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, offices, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 2 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
