

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of the

"Silver Hammer Publishing Company"--Limited.

Know all men by these presents that we the undersigned have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Idaho, and we hereby set forth and declare:

I

That the name of the said corporate Company is and shall be the "Silver Hammer Publishing Company"--Limited, and by that name it shall be known and do business.

II

That the purpose for which the said Company is formed are to be a general news paper, printing and publishing business, and to so carry on said business, as may be incident to, and in furtherance of the said company's principal objects, as above set forth, and to do all acts toward the acquisition of the necessary property for said purposes, and to impose or cause or require, in the name of the corporation, and exercise all rights and privileges guaranteed by the corporations of the laws of the state of Idaho.

III

That the capital stock of the said corporation shall be twelve thousand dollars, divided into twelve hundred shares, at the value of ten dollars each.

IV

That the said company's principal place of business, shall be the Town of Rexburg, Fremont County, State of Idaho.

V

That the term of existence of the said company shall be fifty years from and after its incorporation.

That the number of directors of the said publishing company shall be 7 and the names of those chosen to act for the first year, and their residences are as follows to-wit:
