To acquire by gift, grant, purchase, devise, lease, or otherwise, both real and personal property necessary or convenient to the carrying out of the social, religious and benevolent purposes of this corporation, and to own, hold, use, enjoy and dispose of the same in such manner as it may determine; that such powershall include the buildings and property used directly in the work and operations of this corporation and also property, real and personal, the rents, issues, profits, and proceeds of which shall be applied in the work and operations of this corporation;

To sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, encumber, alienate, transfer, or convey all or any of the real or personal property of the corporation, at such times and in such manners as it shall determine;

To own, furnish and operate a Young Men's Christian Association Building in the city of Boise, with dormitories and business rooms in conjunction therewith and with rooms for such other purposes as it shall determine, and to lease and rent portions of the said building and collect the rents therefor;

To borrow money for the carrying out of any or all its purposes and to issue and execute notes, mortgages, bonds, or other evidence of indebtedness for the same, in such form as it may dem advisable, and to secure the repayment of such indebtedness when and as it shall determine;

To enter into, make, perform, and carry out contracts of any and every sort or kind with any person, firm, association or corporation not inconsistent with these Afticles and the laws of the State of Idaho relating to corporations not organized for pecuniary profit;

To make such By-Laws, rules and regulations as it shall determine;

Generally and without limitations to do all and everything permitted by the Statutes of the State of Idaho necessary, convenient, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of all or any of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of this corporation, or for the carrying out of its objects and purposes, but not for pecuniary profit or advantage;

This corporation is not organized for pecuniary profit or advantage.
