

DESIGNATION OF AGENT AND ACCEPTANCE OF THE PROVISIONS OF  
THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO

K N O W   A L L   M E N   B Y   T H E S E   P R E S E N T S

THAT the Western Union Telegraph Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, having heretofore filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Idaho, a duly authenticated copy of its Articles of Incorporation, and having in pursuance of the laws of the State of Idaho, made certificate designating Ada County in the State of Idaho, as the County in which the principal place of business of such corporation in said State of Idaho should be conducted, and having designated G.H.Hackett, residing at Boise, in said Ada County, as the authorized agent of said corporation in said State of Idaho, upon whom process issued by authority of or under any law of the State of Idaho, might be served as provided by the Constitution and laws of said State of Idaho.

NOW the said Western Union Telegraph Company does hereby revoke the designation of G.H.Hackett as such agent, and the said Western Union Telegraph Company does hereby continue the designation of Ada County in the State of Idaho as the County in which the principal place of business of said corporation in said State of Idaho is and shall be conducted, and does hereby designate L.C.Floria, residing at Boise, in said Ada County, as the authorized agent of said corporation in said State of Idaho upon whom process issued by authority of or under any law of the State of Idaho, may be served as provided by the Constitution, and laws of said State of Idaho.

And the said Western Union Telegraph Company, desiring and intending to conform in all respects to the Constitution and laws of said State and to avail itself of the rights, privileges and immunities guaranteed by said Con<sup>ti</sup>

stitution and laws, does hereby accept the provisions of the Constitution of the State of Idaho for all the intents and the purposes contemplated by the provisions thereof relating to such acceptance by other than municipal corporations (article 11, section 7, Constitution of Idaho) provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed as a waiver of any right or privilege possessed by the said Western Union Telegraph Company under and by virtue of the act of Congress of July 24, 1866, titled 65, U. S. compiled Statutes, 1918, Section 10,072.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said Western Union Telegraph Company has caused this certificate and acceptance to be executed and delivered in its name, and on its behalf by its Vice-President and to be attested by its Assistant secretary, and hath caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed at New York in the County of New York, State of New York, this        day of August, 1919.
