INCORPORATION ARTICLES O F 0 F THE COWBOY'S ASSOCIATION, INC. IDAHO KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, PONS D. HUNT, of American Falls, Idaho; GARRETT M STACK, of American Falls, Idaho; ALLEN HUNT, of Burley, Idaho; JAMES POULTON, of Burley, Idaho and HOWARD ROBINSON, of Burley, Idaho, being bonofide residents of the State of Idaho and/citizens of the United States of America, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and in the manner prescribed by Idaho Code and the business and purposes of which corporation shall be: ARTICLE I Said Corporation shall be named and known as IDAHO COWBOY'S ASSOCIATION, INC., hereinafter referred to as "I. C. A.". ARTICLE II The general nature, purpose and objects for which the Corporation is formed are: (1) To organize non-profit associations and corporations and rodeo contestants in the State of Idaho that promote rodeos for the purpose of promoting their mutual protection and benefit. (2) To work for the betterment of conditions of rodeos and to raise the standards of rodeos and comboy contestants, and to produce better rodeos for the enjoyment of the public. (3) To secure competent, honest judges and officials for all rodeos and to supervise and require that all entrance fees of participating cowboys be added to the prize money. (4) To bring about homest advertising by promoters of rodeos so that the public may rely upon the truth of advertised events in which members of the ICA participate in or sponsor. (5) To publish information concerning the dates of rodeos, names of contestants, the prize money and other pertinent particulars concerning cowboys, promoters, and sponsors in which the public is interested and members of the ICA are interested. (6) To provide a means whereby rodeo sponsors may contract with top rodeo promoters and thereby improve the quality of Rodeo shows presented to the public. (7) To promote the highest, most ethical standards of policy for promoters, sponsers and participants of rodeos. (8) To adopt and approve official rules for the ICA and for the sponsors, promoters and contestants of rodeos sponsored by ICA membeers (9) To provide a uniform set of rules for contestants in ICA rodeos and for guidance and direction of judges of all ICA rodeos.

Article of Incorporation of the Idaho Cowboy's Association (PAGE #2)

ARTICLE III

This shall be a non-profit corporation, with all members having equal rights and privileges and receiving a membership card as proof thereof which is non-assignable. The corporation shall have perpetual existance.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBER SHIP

Membership shall be of three classes: (a) Participants in the Arena (b) Producers. (c) Sponsors.

ARTICLE V

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be in American Falls, Idaho.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS

- (1) An annual meeting of the members of the ICA shall be held once in each calender year on the first Saturday in November. The place of said meeting to be decided upon by the ICA members at the annual meeting.
- (2) A quorum at the annual meeting or any special meeting called by the board of directors shall be over half of the members of the Board
- (3) The President of the ICA may call a meeting of the Board of Directors at any time, providing each member is given at least five (5) days advance notice of the meeting. Any two Directors may also c_all a meeting of the Board of Directors after having given similar notice.

ARTICLE VII

- (1) The Board of Directors shall omnsist of nine (9) members, all of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting of the ICA.
- (2) The Board of Directors will assume office each year, three weeks after election for a period of one year.
- (3) At all meetings of the Board of Directors, a majority shall constitute a quorum.
- (4) The names and addresses of the persons elected to office and to the Board of Directors for the year 1955 are: (See page "A", 'Officers and Directors)

ARTICLEVIII CORPORATE POWERS

The corporate poers of the ICA shall be vested in the Board of Directors, and shall be exercised by them in accordance with these Articles and the By-Laws of said Corporation, and they are possessed of the legislative and rule making powers. The Board of Directors make may make all rules which it considers necessary to carry out the purposes of the ICA and any and all contracts incidental thereto.

ARTICLE IX

- (1) The officers of the ICA shall be as follows: President, Vice President: Secretary and Treasurer.
- (2) The President shall preside at all meetings of the ICA and the Board of Directors. Thus In the absence or disability of the President the Vice President shall perform his his duties. In the absence of both, a member chosen by the members present shall act as President Pro-tem.

ARTICLE IX (Continued)

(3) The officers shall be elected by the ICA members at the annual meeting, and any member in order to qualify for office must be a member in good standing in the ICA.

ARTICLE X

Any monies or profit obtained by the Corporation shall not be distributed to the members thereof and any pecuniary profits shall be used for the promotion and betterment of rodeos and in elevating the standards of rodeos.
