ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION SECRETARY OF STATE

OF

COURTS OF EXCELLENCE, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENT, That we, the undersigned, Courts of Excellence, Inc. each being a natural person of full age, and a citizen of the United States of America, have voluntarily and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and we do hereby certify, declare and adopt the following articles of incorporation:

Ι

CORPORATE NAME

The name of this non-profit corporation shall be Courts of Excellence, Inc.

II

EXISTENCE

The period of existence and duration of the life of this non-profit corporation shall be perpetual.

·III

REGISTERED AGENT

The name, location and address of the registered agent and registered office of this non-profit corporation shall be as follows:

PURPOSES

The nature of the business and the objectives and purposes of this non-profit corporation shall be:

To help create conditions within our community which contribute to the positive development of youth by assisting in the funding and administration of funds of those probation and diversion programs; training efforts; community, educational and informational programs; non-traditionally funded staff positions; promotion costs; building costs; and other support costs not otherwise funded but determined to be necessary to the reasonable operation of the Ada County Juvenile Court. To that end this corporation shall be formed and conduct itself as a non-profit corporation for Federal and State tax purposes as defined by § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

This non-profit corporation's exclusive purpose is for charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes as defined by \$ 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

To buy, sell, acquire, transfer, exchange, lease, rent, occupy and possess, whether for business or commercial purposes, real property including but not limited to, timber, water and minerals of all kinds and nature, and to sell, subdivide, separate and segregate for sale, lease, transfer, exchange or purchase, any and all portions of such real property to which the

non-profit corporation may own, possess or hold option or title of any kind.

To purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, sell, assign, endorse, transfer, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, or otherwise dispose of and to deal generally in notes, bonds, contracts, stocks, warrants, bills, open accounts, and other evidences of indebtedness of individuals, firms, partnerships and corporations, municipal, public and private, except as limited by law; and to loan its funds, with or without security, on notes, open accounts or otherwise.

To purchase, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire and own, hold, use, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge, exchange, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every kind and description, including but not limited to shares of stock, bonds, debentures, notes, evidences of indebtedness and other securities, contracts, or obligations of any non-profit corporation or corporations, association or associations, domestic or foreign, and to pay therefore in whole or in part in cash or by exchanging therefore stocks, bonds, or other evidences of indebtedness or securities of this or any other corporation, and while the owner or holder of any such real or personal property, stocks, bonds, debentures, notes, evidences of indebtedness or other securities, contracts, or obligations, to receive, collect, and dispose of

the interest, dividends and income arising from such property, and to possess and exercise in respect thereof, all the rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including all voting powers on any stocks, so owned.

To institute, enter into, carry on, assist, promote or participate in financial, commercial, mercantile, industrial and other business works, enterprises, undertakings and operations.

To enter into, make and perform and carry out contracts of every sort and kind with any person, firm, association or corporation, municipality, body politic, country, territory, district, state and government.

To buy, take, lease, rent, option, or in any other manner acquire, own, hold, possess, sell, exchange, lease, convey, transfer, rent, mortgage, give liens against, or in any other manner dispose of or encumber real estate necessary to the purposes and objectives of the non-profit corporation and any and all estates and interests therein, whether within or without the State of Idaho.

To apply for, secure, acquire by assignment, transfer, purchase or otherwise, and to exercise, carry out and enjoy any charter, license, power, authority, franchise, concession, rights or privileges, which any government or authority or any corporation or other public body may be empowered to grant; and to pay

for, aid in and contribute toward carrying the same into effect, and to appropriate any of the non-profit corporation's assets to defray the necessary costs, charges and expenses thereof.

To acquire, and pay for in cash, the good-will, rights assets and property and to undertake or assume the whole or any part of the obligations or liabilities of any person, firm, association or non-profit corporation.

In the purchase or acquisition of property, business, rights or franchises, or for additional working capital, or for any other object in or about its business or affairs, and without limit as to amount to incur debt, and to raise, borrow, and secure the payment of money in any lawful manner, including the issue and sale or other disposition of bonds, debentures, obligations, negotiable and transferable instruments and evidences of indebtedness of all kinds, whether secured by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust or otherwise.

To carry on any other business, which may seem to the non-profit corporation capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the non-profit corporation's property or rights.

To do each and every thing necessary, suitable, useful or advisable for the accomplishment of any one or more of said

objects, or which shall, at any time, appear to be conducive to or expedient for the benefit of said non-profit corporation in connection therewith.

To do each and all things set forth herein to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might do or could do in the State of Idaho, and in any other state, country or place.

To have one or more offices, and to carry on all or any of its operation and business and without restriction or limit as to amount, and to purchase, or otherwise acquire, to hold, own, to mortgage, sell, convey, or otherwise acquire, to hold, own, to mortgage, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description in any of the states and districts of the United States.

The foregoing clauses shall be construed as objects, purposes and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that an enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this non-profit corporation.

In general, to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of Idaho upon non-profit corporations, notwithstanding the above provisions of these articles, the non-profit corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal

Income Tax under \$ 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

V

DIRECTOR'S POWERS

In furtherance, and not in limitation of the powers conferred by statute, the board of directors is expressly authorized:

To make, alter, amend, or repeal by-laws of this non-profit corporation, and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgage and liens upon the real and personal property of this non-profit corporation.

The board of directors shall have power and authority at any meeting to sell, lease or exchange all of the property and assets of this non-profit corporation, including its good-will and its corporate franchises, upon such terms and conditions as its board of directors deem expedient and for the best interest of the non-profit corporation.

This non-profit corporation may in its by-laws confer powers upon its directors in addition to the foregoing, and in addition to the powers and authorities expressly conferred upon them by statute.

MEMBER LIABILITY

The private property of the members shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever.

VIII

DISSOLUTION

Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation which has established its tax exempt status under \$501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

IX

NON-STOCK BASIS

Courts of Excellence, Inc. is organized on a non-stock basis and shall have no authority to issue shares of capital stock. All conditions, qualifications, requirements, privileges and regulations as to membership in the Courts of Excellence, Inc., or the Board of Directors, including voting rights, shall be fixed and governed by the By-Laws of Courts of Excellence, Inc.

AMENDMENT

This non-profit corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provisions contained in these articles of incorporation in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute, and all rights conferred upon the members herein are granted, subject to this reservation.

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being the President and Secretary of Courts of Excellence, Inc., for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation to do business both within and without the State of Idaho, and in pursuant of the laws of the State of Idaho and the regulations of the Internal Revenue Service, do make and file these amended articles of incorporation, hereby declaring and certifying that the facts herein stated are true, and accordingly have hereunto set our hands and seals this first (1st) day of June, 1987.
