ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

SEVENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF IDAHO LEGAL AID SOCIETY, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit cooperative association under the general corporation laws of the State of Idaho, Chapter 10, Title 30, of the Idaho Code of 1947.

ARTICLE I

The purposes of this non-profit cooperative association shall be:

- (a) To provide a program throughout the counties comprising the Seventh Judicial District of Idaho, to-wit: Canyon, Gem, Payette, Washington, Adams and Owyhee, for free legal aid and services to the poor in those counties, and such other counties in the state as this Board of Directors may desire to offer such aid and services.
- (b) The eligibility standards for persons entitled to free legal aid and services shall be more fully set forth in the by-laws adopted by the non-profit association. However, it is the association's primary purpose and desire to inaugurate and initiate a program for legal assistance for the poverty stricken people as set forth in sub-paragraph (a) above. It is further the intent and purpose of the incorporators of this non-profit cooperative association to offer a program of free legal aid and services to the poverty stricken people in those areas where a fee is not generated by the case or transaction itself, and further elaboration of this legal aid and services program shall be contained in the by-laws of this non-profit cooperative association.
- (c) It is further the purpose of this non-profit cooperative association to provide legal aid and services to any person within Idaho as provided above, and no person shall be denied the privilege of free legal aid and services by virtue of his race, color or national origin.
- (d) Said corporation shall have all the power, capacity and authority as conferred upon it by the general corporation law of the State of Idaho.
- (e) Said non-profit cooperative association

shall have the power, capacity and authority to do all acts necessary in order to accomplish its prime purpose of providing free legal aid and services to the poor.

ARTICLE 11

The duration of this non-profit cooperative association shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The post office address of the registered office of this non-profit cooperative association shall be 914 Main Street, Caldwell, Idaho.

ARTICLE IV

No capital stock shall be issued by this non-profit cooperative association, but shall issue membership certificates in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 30-1004 of the Idaho Code of 1947. All members of this association's interest shall be equal, and no member can have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member.

ARTICLE V

The membership of this non-profit cooperative association shall not be limited, and shall be open to all who believe in the prime purpose as set forth in Article I to provide legal aid and services to the poor, and who meet the qualifications as set forth in the by-laws of said association.

ARTICLE VI

Commencing with the annual meeting to held on the 2nd Monday in August, 1967, the Board of Directors shall be elected by the membership of the said non-profit cooperative association and as provided in the by-laws, as to number and qualifications for such office.

ARTICLE VII
