ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of the

SPOKANE AND BUFFALO HUMP GOLD MINING COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we the undersigned, citizens of the United States, and residents of the State of Washington, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Washington, and to that end we do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICIE I.

The name of the corporation shall be the "Spokane and Buffalo Hump Gold Mining Company".

ARTICLE II.

The objects for which this corporation is formed are:

- 1. To carry on the business of mining, milling, smelting and reduction of ores of all kinds in the States of Washington and Idaho and elsewhere.
- 2. To acquire by purchase, or otherwise acquire, and to own mining claims in the State of Washington, in the State of Idaho, and in such other places as the Board of Trustees may deem advisable.
- 3. To acquire by purchase, or otherwise acquire, and to own, construct and operate all water rights, lands, mills, machinery, buildings and appliances of every kind necessary or convenient for the proper working of such mines, or other properties as man be required by the said corporation, of for the proper working or shipping of the ores therefrom.
- 4. To operate mining claims, and to extract the ores therefrom and to smelt, reduce or otherwise treat the same.
- 5. To sell and convey any and all mining claims, and any property which said company may acquire.

6. To purchase from the subscribers to the capital stock such mining claims and other property as the Board of Trustees may deem proper, and to receive such mining claims and other property in payment of subscriptions to the capital stock in such amounts as the Board of Trustees may think proper, and to issue stock therefor.

7. To engage in such other business as the Board of Trustees of the Company may direct.

ARTICLE III.

The said stock shall be assessable to an additional amount of Five (5) cents per share upon assessment to be levied by the Board of Trustees, provided, however, that the aggregate of all assessments levied in any one month shall not exceed one mill per share of the capital stock, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the capital stock of the corporation at a meeting called for that purpose the Board of Trustees shall be authorized to increase such assessments for any one month.

ARTICLE IV.

The term for which this corporation shall exist is Fifty (50) years from and after date of its incorporation.

ARTICLE V.

The number of Trustees who shall manage the concerns of this corporation shall be Five, and the names of those who shall manage its concerns until the first Monday in August, 1833, are:

Cyrus Happy, J.W. Binkley and C. O'Brien, all residents of the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington; David Stussi, a resident of the City of Grangeville, County and State of Idaho, and T. Mayne Daly, a resident of the City of Rossland, in the Province of British Columbia.

ARTICLE VI.

That the principal place of business of this corporation shall be at the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington.
