eral telephone business. Heretofore it owned certain telephone  
property in the State of Idaho and conducted a telephone busi-  
ness therein. Heretofore, to-wit, about November, 1910, this  
company sold all of its property in the State of Idaho to Com-  
mercial Telegraph & Telephone Company, a corporation of the  
State of New Jersey, and since such time this company has not  
owned any property in the State of Idaho, and does not now  
own any property in such State, and since such time this com-  
pany has not conducted any business in such State; neither does  
this company intend to transact at any time in the future any  
business in the State of Idaho.

WHEREFORE, it is prayed and suggested that  
the tax against this company in the State of Idaho should be  
cancelled.
