Adopted April 1, 1976

Donnelly Rural Fire Protection Association, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under the provisions of Title 30, Chapter 1, Section 117 A, Idaho Code (hereinafter called the "corporation"), does hereby certify as follows:

That the following amendment of the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation has been duly adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 30-146, Idaho Code:

The Articles of Incorporation of the corporation are hereby amended by adding a new Article M-eto designated Article X, reading as follows:

ARTICLE X

This corporation is one which does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof and it is organized solely for non-profit purposes. In the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, sufficient payment of or adequate provision for the debts and obligations of the corporation, or to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501 subdivision (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. If this corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such manner as may be directed by decree of the District Court of the county in which this corporation's principal office is located, on petition therefor by any person concerned in the liquidation.
