I, PETE T. CENARRUSA, Secretary of State of the State of Idaho, and legal custodian of the corporation records of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify that the original of the articles of incorporation of

HAUSER LAKE ROD AND GUN CLUB, INC.

was filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the third day of November A. D. One Thousand Nine Hundred seventy-two and to be duly recorded on Film Nemicrofilm of Record of Domestic Corporations, of the State of Idaho, and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Section 30-103 and Sections 30-1001 to 30-1005, inclusive, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

HAUSER LAKE ROD AND GUN CLUB, INC.

The signatories to these Articles hereby associate as a non-profit cooperative association under the laws of the State of Idaho, and particularly Sections 30-1001 to 30-1006, Idaho Code, and amendments thereto and correlated provisions of the laws of the State of Idaho.

ARTICLE I

The name of this association shall be:

HAUSER LAKE ROD AND GUN CLUB, INC.

ARTICLE II

The objects and purposes for which this association is formed are:

- A. To promote interest, and holding trap shooting, skeet shooting, rifle shooting and pistol shooting, and to promote and provide social and athletic recreation for its members; to give and promote entertainments, social affairs, exhibitions, games and amusements of any and all descriptions for the general enjoyment and instruction of its members and the public; to provide shooting matches among its own members and members of other similarly constituted organizations and/or amongst members of the general public for the enjoyment, benefit, instruction and well being of its members and the general public. To purchase or lease and to maintain and operate buildings, club houses or other structures as incidental to the above purposes and to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the same.
- B. To borrow from any source, money, goods or services without limitation as to amount of corporate indebtedness or liability; and to pledge or mortgage any of its property as security therefor in any manner permitted by law.
- C. To buy, lease, hold and exercise all privileges of ownership in and to the real or personal property as may be necessary or convenient for the conduct and operation of the business of the association, or incidental thereto.

- D. To acquire and to hold, own and exercise all rights of ownership in, and to sell, transfer or pledge shares of capital stock or bonds or become a member of a stock holder of any corporation or association engaged in any related activities.
- E. To establish reserves and to invest the funds thereof in stocks, bonds and other property as the Board of Directors may deem satisfactory.
- F. To have and to exercise all powers, privileges and rights conferred on corporations by laws of the State of Idaho, and all powers and rights incidental in carrying out the purposes for which this association is formed, except such as are inconsistent with the express provisions of the act under which the association is incorporated.
- G. The foregoing shall be construed both as objects and powers and the enumeration thereof shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers conferred on this association by the laws of the State of Idaho, all of which are hereby expressly claimed.

ARTICLE III

The place where the principal business of the association is to be transacted is at Hauser Lake, Idaho, but the association may maintain offices and places of business at such other places within the State of Idaho as the Board of Directors may determine.

ARTICLE IV

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE V

The private property of the members shall not be subject to payment of association debts to any extent whatever.

ARTICLE VI

Section 1: This association shall not have capital stock, and its capital shall be represented by membership certificates which shall be issued and subject to ownership in accordance with the By-Laws of this Association.

Section 2: This association shall, by its By-Laws, provide the terms and conditions of membership.

Section 3. Membership fees shall be fixed and regulated by the By-Laws. Each member, whose fees are fully paid and who is not in arrears regarding payments for dues, shall be entitled to one vote at any meeting of the members of the association, for each membership certificate held. Assessments against members, and a determination of their liability, shall be fixed by the By-Laws, of this association, which shall provide for the manner of collection and its enforcement and also for the lapse of membership and forfeiture of the right to the use of the association's facilities, for the non-payment of membership fees.

Section 4. This association is organized as a non-profit association for the mutual benefit of its members and will not have profits. All fees received for admission of members shall be placed in the surplus fund to be used only for the payment of indebtedness, repairs, building and maintenance. After all expenses of the association are paid each year, and a reasonable reserve, as determined by the Board of Directors, set aside, any income of the association in excess thereof, shall be used to reduce the charges for the next years operations. The rights and interests of all members shall be equal, and no member shall have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member.

ARTICLE VII

The number, qualifications, terms of office, manner of election, time and place, manner of calling of meetings, and the powers and duties of the Board of Directors shall be prescribed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VIII

Upon dissolution, in event this association is dissolved, all assets remaining after payment of obligations and debts shall be distributed to all members as their interest appears on the records which interest shall be based upon their individual patronage as in the By-Laws and Articles provided. Sufficient records shall be maintained to show each individual interest.
