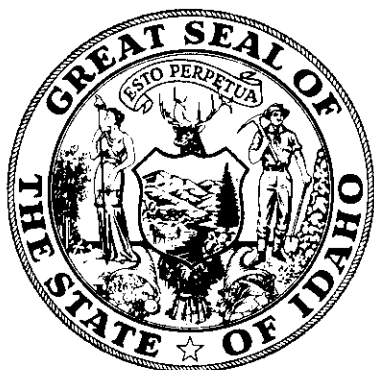

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF
ACORN LEARNING CENTER, INC.

* * * * *

I

The name of this corporation is Acorn Learning Center, Inc.

II

This corporation is formed pursuant to Idaho Code §30-301 through §30-332, as a nonprofit corporation for the establishment and perpetual succession of an institution of learning, and is granted all powers conferred by Idaho law pertaining to such corporations.

III

The purpose of this corporation is to provide a learning environment for children which recognizes the need for individualized curricula, the value of creativity in children and teachers, and the involvement of parents in the learning process.

IV

The institution of learning, to be known as Acorn Learning Center, Inc., together with all offices of this corporation, shall be located at 139 Sixth Avenue East, City of Twin Falls, County of Twin Falls, State of Idaho 83301.

V

There shall be five (5) directors of this corporation. *Same as incorporators as per Gloria Hann*

VI

VII

For the accomplishment of the aforementioned educational purposes, the corporation may:

1. Receive monies, equipment, property, or labor from any source including, but not limited to, private sources, governmental sources, or whatever, and purchase, convey, mortgage and lease all kinds of real and personal property or otherwise use the funds.

2. Borrow money and draw, make, accept, endorse, assign, guarantee, execute and issue notes, checks, drafts, bonds, debentures, negotiable instruments and other instruments for the payment of money and mortgage or pledge its property to secure such obligations.

3. Loan money and accept notes, checks, drafts, bonds, debentures, negotiable instruments and other instruments for the payment of money and receive mortgages or pledges of property to secure such obligations accepted.

4. To do all things necessary, essential, convenient, or proper for the accomplishment of any and all of the aforementioned purposes for the attainment of any and all of the objects above mentioned, or incident to the powers herein named, or which shall have at any time appeared to be conducive or expedient or beneficial to the corporation, and

1 to such end to have any and all powers conferred upon
2 nonprofit cooperative associations and corporations organized
3 under the statutes of the State of Idaho as now constituted
4 and as may be provided by future amendments thereto.

5 5. To exercise and perform all of the above
6 described powers both within and without the State of Idaho.

7 6. This corporation is organized exclusively for
8 charitable, educational, and scientific purposes including,
9 for such purposes, the making of distributions to organiza-
10 tions that qualify as exempt organizations under Section
11 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the
12 corresponding provision of any future United States Internal
13 Revenue Law).

14 VIII

15 No part of the net earnings of the corporation
16 shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its
17 members, trustees, officers, or other private persons,
18 except that the corporation shall be authorized and empow-
19 ered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered
20 and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the
21 purposes set forth in Articles III and IV hereof. No sub-
22 stantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be
23 the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to
24 influence legislation, and the corporation shall not par-
25 ticipate in, or intervene (including the publishing or
26 distribution of statements) in any political campaign on
27 behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding
28 any other provision of these Articles, this corporation
29 shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any
30 activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance
31

1 of the purposes of this corporation.

3 IX

4 Acorn Learning Center, Inc. will not discriminate
5 against applicants and students on the basis of race, color
6 or creed. This policy includes, but is not limited to,
7 racially non-discriminatory administration by the school of
8 admissions, scholarship programs, athletic programs, extra-
9 curricular activities that are a part of the school's regular
10 program, and similar activities. This school will not
11 maintain separate classes, separate buildings, separate
12 sections in the cafeteria, or other separate facilities
13 along discriminatory lines.

15 Upon the dissolution of the Acorn Learning Center,
16 Inc. the beneficiaries shall be non-profit learning institu-
17 tions in Twin Falls, Idaho. If such learning institutions
18 are unwilling or unable to accept, the recipient will be any
19 organization under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue
20 Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future
21 United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees
22 shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall
23 be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in
24 which the principal office of the corporation is then located,
25 exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or
26 organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are
27 organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
