### CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

I, **FRED E. LUKENS**, Secretary of State of the State of Idaho, and legal custodian of the corporation records of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify that the original of the articles of incorporation of

**CHURCH OF THE NAZARENE, OF JEROME, IDAHO**

was filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the **twenty-fifth** day of **October** **A. D. One Thousand Nine Hundred and thirty** and is duly recorded in Book **A-24** of Record of Domestic Corporations of the State of Idaho, and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Section 3 of Chapter 262 of the 1929 Session Laws of Idaho, and Sections 4870 and 4871, Idaho Compiled Statutes, as amended by Chapter 196 of the 1925 Session Laws.

AND I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name stated in the articles, and for **a term of fifty years** from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at **Jerome** in the County of **Jerome**, and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Religious, Ex-Service Men, Benevolent, Charitable and Fraternal Corporations, as provided in Chapter 196, Idaho Compiled Statutes.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the Great Seal of the State. Done at Boise City, the Capital of Idaho, this **twenty-fifth** day of **October**, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and **thirty**, and of the Independence of the United States of America the One Hundred and **Fifty-fifth**.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the undersigned, a majority of the members thereof, do hereby associate ourselves for the purpose of forming a Religious, Social and Benevolent Corporation under and in accordance with Chapter 196 Idaho Compiled Statutes 1919, and do certify as follows, to-wit:

I

That the name of the corporation shall be Church of the Nazarene, of Jerome, Idaho;

II

The purposes of the corporation shall be to maintain, conduct, manage and operate a religious organization in accordance with the Manual of the General church of the Nazarene; also to own or hold such real and personal property as may be necessary for the business and objects of the corporation;

III

The place where its principal business is to be transacted shall be the City of Jerome, Jerome County, State of Idaho;

IV

The term for which it is to exist is the term of fifty years;

V

That at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. on the 17th day of October 1930, in the City of Jerome, Jerome County, State of Idaho, a meeting was held at which a majority of the members of such association were present for the election of two boards of trustees as follows:

One board of three members whose duty it shall be to manage the real estate of the corporation, and

One board of five members whose duty it shall be to promote, operate and maintain said corporation.

That notice of such election was given by publication in the Jerome County Journal on October 2nd, October 9th and October 16th, 1930, it being a newspaper published weekly in the City of Jerome, Jerome County, State of Idaho;

VI

That said corporation shall have no capital stock, and it shall not be conducted, managed or maintained for pecuniary gain.
