KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, all of whom are natural persons of full age and citizens of the United States of America, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and we hereby certify in writing:

ARTICLE I.

Name

The name of said corporation shall be The R-G Mining Company, Inc.

ARTICLE II.

Objects, Purposes, and Powers

The objects and purposes for which said corporation is formed, and the powers which it shall possess are as follows:

To locate, buy, acquire, own, enter, lease, exchange, sell, convey, and deal in mines, mining claims, mineral rights, and mineral lands of every kind, nature, and description; also to purchase, locate, or otherwise acquire, own, enter, lease, sell, exchange, and deal in millsites, water rights, timber, grazing, and other lands, and terminal facilities, and to conduct all business appertaining thereto; to explore, work, operate, prospect, and develop mines and mineral lands of every nature and description, either for itself or for other companies, corporations, or individuals, upon such terms or for such remuneration as it shall deem fit and proper, and to accept, take, and hold mineral lands of every nature or description, either as an entirety or any interest in the same;

To carry on and conduct a general business of mining,

1 milling, concentrating, converting, smelting, reducing, treating, preparing for market, marketing, manufacturing, buying, selling, exchanging, and otherwise producing and dealing in all kinds of ores, bullion, metals, minerals, and concentrates, and the products and by-products thereof, and in doing the same to construct, build, buy, sell, own, and operate all necessary mills, smelters, machinery, equipment, roads, railroads, tramways, ditches, flumes, and such other property as shall be fit and necessary in carrying out the objects herein stated; to erect buildings, operate sawmills, and engage in trade of every kind, both in stores and provisions, steam, electric, and other transportation, road building and engineering, freighting and carrying;

To locate, purchase, lease, and acquire land with the exclusive right to prospect, drill, mine, bore, and sink wells and shafts; to produce, convey and transport oil, petroleum and gas: to carry on the business of storing and prospecting for, mining, producing, refining, manufacturing, storing, piping, transporting, buying and selling petroleum and other oil products and by-products; to buy, sell, furnish and supply the same; to operate, build, construct, pump, operate and maintain oil and gas wells; to build, construct, purchase, maintain and operate warehouses, pumping plants, pipe lines, refineries, factories, mills, workshops, laboratories, and dwelling houses for workmen and others; to manufacture, buy, sell, import, export, and deal in pumps, drills, fuses, caps, candles, nitroglycerine, dynamite, and the necessary machinery, engines, drills, and all appliances and conveniences for use in connection with mining and drilling for oil and gas; to engage in a general oil or mineral brokerage business by buying, selling, or otherwise trading in mineral lands or the products or by-products of mineral lands;

To buy, sell, lease, or otherwise acquire or dispose of all kinds of instruments, appliances, machines, tools, equipment,

and electrical and engineering products; to design, construct, manufacture, and generally deal in such instruments, appliances, machines, equipment, and electrical and engineering products; to buy, sell, or otherwise acquire or dispose of buildings for factories, laboratories, warehouses, and offices.

To buy, sell, lease, or otherwise acquire or deal with and in all kinds of merchandise, material, and machinery, and to carry on a general merchandise business of buying and selling; to act as agent for manufacturers and others in buying and selling all kinds of articles, both manufactured or unmanufactured or in the process of manufacture; to import and export all kinds of goods and materials to foreign countries, as well as to sell all kinds of goods in the United States; to manufacture all kinds of machinery, merchandise, and materials, and to repair the same, and take contracts therefor; to do all kinds of work and supply all kinds of materials in the construction or repair of buildings.

To manufacture, buy, sell, import and export, lease, and deal or trade in manufacturers, mill and contractors supplies, engines, boilers, machinery, tools, machine shop and electrical supplies and appliances, and all accessories pertaining to the same.

To carry on business as timber merchants, sawmill proprietors, and timber growers, and to buy, eell, grow, prepare for market, manipulate, import, export, and deal in timber and wood of all kinds and to manufacture and deal in articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which timber or wood is used, to purchase and deal in timber rights or concessions, and to cut, clear, plant, and work timber estates, and to carry on any other businesses which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any of the above, or calculated directly or indirectly to render profitable or enhance the value of the company's property or rights for the time being.

To carry on a general lumber, logging, tanning, and milling business, to lease, purchase, and hold timber lands and other lands in connection therewith; to buy, cut, sell, manufacture, and ship timber, lumber, pulp, tanbark, and the products thereof; construct, own, lease, and operate sawmills, pulp mills, tanbark mills, and other mills; also tramroads, railroads, logging and other roads, and steamboats and barges, for the transportation of the said commodities to and from said mills; also booms of every kind at and near said mills, for the purpose of catching and holding logs and other timber to be used and manufactured at said mills; carry on a general merchandising business in connection with said lumber and milling business, and to do all things legal, necessary, or proper to be done for the successful conduct of the business herein contemplated and incident to said business;

To purchase, secure, use, own, and enjoy any and all franchises useful and beneficial for the prosecution of the business of said corporation; to sell, assign, or otherwise deal in and use patents, patent rights, privileges, licenses, trademarks, trade names, devices, and improved or secret processes of every sort and description necessary or incidental to these purposes;

Tomexercise the right of eminent domain according to law, and condemn and acquire rights of way for tunnels, shafts, hoisting works, dumps, cuts, ditches, canals, reservoirs, storage basins, dams, roads, railroads, tramways, and terminal facilities, incident, necessary, or convenient for the uses and purposes and objects of said corporation;

To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, ennvey, mortgage, or lease real and personal property; to dispose of, sell, lease, mortgage, assign, transfer, or convey any rights, privileges, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation, other than its franchise of being a corporation; and to

acquire, purchase, guarantee, hold, mortgage, own, vote, sell, 1 2 pledge, or otherwise dispose of and deal in shares, bonds, securities and debentures and other evidences of indebtedness or 3 other corporations, domestic or foreign, and while the holder of 4 any shares of stock, to exercise all the rights and privileges 5 6 of ownership, including the right to vote thereon to the same 7 extent as a natural person might or could do; 8

To purchase, acquire, hold, sell, transfer, and reissue the shares of its own capital stock, provided it shall not use its funds or property for the purchase of its own shares of capital stock when such use would cause any impairment of the capital stock of this corporation:

To enter into contracts of obligations of any type or kind essential, necessary, or proper to the transaction of its ordinary affairs, or for the purposes of the corporation;

To borrow money on its notes, bonds, or other obligations for the general purposes of the corporation, and to mortgage, pledge, and give in trust any and all of its property, real and personal, to secure the payment thereof;

To do all things incident to the general business of this 21 | corporation in the State of Idaho, in the other states, territories, 22 and colonial possessions of the United States and in foreign 23 | countries, and to have one or more offices and places of business out of the State of Idaho, and to acquire, receive, hold, purchase, lease, mortgage, dispose of or convey real and personal property situate out of the State of Idaho; and there to hold such meetings of stockholders or directors as may seem necessary to the operation of their business:

To conduct and carry on any other business, whether 30 manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the company capable 31 of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business 32 or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of

the company or render profitable any of the company s property or rights.

To do each and everything necessary, suitable, useful, and advisable for the accomplishment of any one or more of the purposes, or for the attainment of any of the objects, or for the exercise of any of the powers herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive to or expedient for the benefit of the corporation.

And finally to do and perform all other things that may be found necessary or convenient or expedient to accomplish the stated purposes of this corporation.

The foregoing clauses shall be construed both as objects and powers and as in furtherance of and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the State of Idaho; and it is hereby expressly provided that the foregoing enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of said corporation.

ARTICLE III.

Duration

The duration of said corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV.

Capital Stock

The total authorized capital stock of said corporation shall be \$300,000.00, divided into 1,200,000 nonassessable shares of the par value of \$.25 each.

ARTICLE V.

Registered Office

The registered office of said corporation in the State of Idaho is the City of Kellogg in the County of Shoshone, State of Idaho, but branch offices may be established elsewhere, either within or without the State of Idaho.

6. Articles of Incorporation

ARTICLE VI.

Directors

The business of said corporation shall be managed by a board of five directors. The directors need not be stockholders of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII.

Authority to Make By-Laws

The power to repeal and amend the By-Laws of said corporation and adopt new By-Laws is hereby conferred upon the directors by a vote of not less than a majority of directors present at a meeting duly called for such purpose, at which a quorum is present.

ARTICLE VIII.

Sale or Lease of Assets - Majority Vote

A voluntary sale, lease, or exchange of all the assets of said corporation may be authorized by the vote of the holders of a majority of the voting power of all shareholders.

ARTICLE IX.

Amendment of Artides - Majority Vote

Any amendment altering the Articles of Incorporation of said corporation in any respect may be adopted by a vote of the holders of a majority of the voting power of all shareholders, unless prohibited by law.

ARTICLE X.

Stock Subscribed

The amount of capital stock of said corporation which has been actually subscribed is three shares of the common capital stock of said corporation, and the following is the name and post office address of each of the incorporators and a statement of the number of shares and par value of the shares acutally subscribed by each:
