ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL PERSONS BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation;

ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation shall be CITIZENS INFORMATION COMMITTEE, INC.

ARTICLE II.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE III.

The purposes for which said corporation is formed are to educate the general public on issues affecting the general welfare, prepare and distribute newsletters, press releases, and other methods of dissemination of information in a non-political, non-partisan manner and in conformance with any law or laws governing the dissemination of information to citizens of the State of Idaho.

ARTICLE IV.

The corporation is nonstock, and no dividends or pecuniary profits will be declared or paid to the members of the corporation.

Additional Directors may be added from time to time as the Directors by majority vote may determine. Directors, once elected shall serve for a term of two years. When the term of

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a Director expires, the membership of the Corporation shall nominate the name of a successor Director to fill the vacancy and a new Director shall be elected by majority vote of the membership. However, nothing herein shall prevent a Director from accepting nomination and election to succeeding terms as a Director.

ARTICLE VII.

The general officers of the corporation shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The principal duties of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the members and Board of Directors and to have general supervision of the affairs of the corporation.

The principal duties of the Vice-President shall be to discharge the duties of the President in the event of absence or disability, for any cause, of the President.

The principal duties of the Secretary shall be to countersign all deeds, leases, and conveyances executed by the corporation, affix the seal of the corporation to all papers required or directed to be sealed, and to keep a record of all proceedings of the Board of Directors, and to safely and systematically keep all books, papers, records, and documents belonging to the corporation, or in any way pertaining to the business of the corporation, except the books and accounts incidental to the duties of the Treasurer.

The principal duties of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all monies, credits, and property of the corporation which come into his or her hands, and to keep an accurate account of all monies received and disbursed, and to render all accounts, statements, and inventories of monies received and disbursed and of money and property on hand, and generally

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all matters pertaining to the office of treasure as required by the Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors may provide for the appointment of additional officers as they may deem for the best interest of the corporation.

Whenever the Board of Directors may order, any two offices, the duties of which do not conflict, may be held by one person.

The officers shall perform additional or different duties as from time to time are imposed by the Board of Directors, or as may be prescribed from time to time by the by-laws.

The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII.

The Board of Directors, by a majority vote, shall have the power to amend these Articles of Incorporation and adopt By-Laws, and to repeal and amend By-Laws.

ARTICLE IX.

The corporation shall have one class of membership and no more than one membership may be held by any one person. The rights and privileges of all members shall be equal. Each member shall be entitled to one vote.

Χ.

Each member shall be assessed dues in an amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. Membership shall commence upon the payment of the dues assessed and acceptance by the corporation and voting privileges are contingent upon payment of dues and otherwise being in good standing with the Corporation.

XI.

In the event of dissolution of the Corporation, the net assets of the corporation are to be

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distributed to each member on a pro rata basis.

XII.

Amendment to these Articles of Incorporation may be proposed by a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors and presented to a quorum of members for their vote. Amendments maybe adopted by a vote of two-thirds of the members of the corporation.
