Articles of Incorporation, Non-Profit**

Attachment with wording for the two sections listed below:

Article 2: The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

To act and operate exclusively as a non-profit corporation pursuant to the laws of the State of Idaho and the Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3), organized for charitable, scientific, educational, disaster preparedness and air response purposes as a multi-discipline, community based volunteer Idaho Bureau of Homeland Security Air Support Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).

1. Services may include:

- Search and Rescue
- Patrol Operations (fire spotting, reconnaissance)
- Disaster Relief
- Fire, Sheriff, Police and other organization Aerial Support
- VIP Transportation and FAM Flights
- Aerial Photography and Mapping
- Special Operations (Drug Interdiction support, Prisoner Transport)
- Logistics Transportation
- Educational Presentations

2. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 2 above hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including publishing or distribution of statement) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

3. The above-stated purposes shall not be construed as a limitation upon the activities of this corporation and it shall be entitled to pursue any other purposes cited in or provided for under the statutes of the State of Idaho, provided that it shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the aforesaid charitable, scientific, educational, preparedness, and air response purposes and in compliance with applicable Internal Revenue Code.

Article 8: Upon dissolution the assets shall be distributed:

for one or more except purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
