THE UNDERSIGNED, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Idaho Business Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporations:

Article 1: Name

The name of the Corporation is: Charolais Care III, Inc.

Article 2: Stock

- 2.a. Shares of Stock. The aggregate number of shares which the corporation shall have the authority to issue is Two Thousand five hundred (2,500).
- 2.b. Common Stock; No Preemptive Rights. All stock shall be common stock, and when fully paid shall be non-assessable. There shall be no preemptive rights with any shareholder to acquire unissued treasury shares. Stock shall be subject to call and redemption in accordance with the Bylaws.
- 2.c. Voting Rights. Each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote.
- 2.d. Restrictions on Transfer. No shareholder may sell or transfer his or her shares except to another individual who is eligible to be a shareholder and only after approval of a simple majority of the transfer at a stockholder's meeting as provided by law and in accordance with the Bylaws.

Article 3: Registered Office and Agent

The principal place of the activities and the registered office of Corporation is at 110 North 800 East; Jerome, Idaho 83338. The registered agent is B. Roy Prescott whose address is the office of the Corporation. Corporation may conduct part or all of its business in any other part of the State of Idaho or any other state where authorized by law.

Article 6: Purpose and Powers

The purpose of the Corporation is to engage in any lawful act or activity for which authorized corporation may be organized under the laws of the State of Idaho including, but not limited to the following:

- 6.a. Nursing Care Facility and Related Business. To engage in the business of providing nursing care services and related businesses. Acquire by purchase, exchange, or otherwise, all, or any part of, or any interest in, the properties, assets, business, and goodwill of any one or more person, firms, associations, or corporations engaged in any business for which a corporation may be organized under the laws of the State of Idaho; pay for the same in eash, property, or corporation's own or other securities; hold, operate, reorganize, liquidate, sell, or in any manner dispose of the whole or any part; and assume or guarantee performance of any liabilities, obligations, or contracts of such persons, firms, associations, or corporations, and to conduct the whole or part of any business acquired.
- 6.c. Borrow Money and Issue Instruments of Indebtedness. Borrow money without limit as to the amount at such rates of interest as Corporation may determine; and to secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge, or other encumbrance of all or any of its property and income.
- 6.d. Enumeration of Purposes and Powers Not Limiting. The enumeration of specific purposes and powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the purposes and powers of the corporation.
