ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned persons, of legal age and residents of the County of Kootenai, State of Idaho, acting as incorporators of a non-profit corporation under the provisions of Chapter 3 of Title 30, Idaho Code, known as the "Idaho Non-Profit Corporation Act," do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation is HOUSE OF HOPE, INC.

ARTICLE II.

This corporation is and shall forever be a non-profit corporation organized exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes within, the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. This corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be under the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation which has established its tax-exempt status under the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE III.

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual, unless otherwise dissolved in accordance with law.

ARTICLE IV.

The purpose of this corporation shall be to provide temporary housing, board and room, meeting facilities and other related facilities and assistance for the purpose of assisting persons who, having received previous treatment and counseling, are recovering from the effects of substance abuse, in their efforts to re-enter society as productive individuals able to care for themselves and to be self sufficient, and to function as

an organization commonly known as a "Halfway House", and to have all powers generally granted to corporations organized in the State of Idaho necessary to carry out their corporate purpose.

ARTICLE V.

The membership of this corporation shall consist of the original board of directors, and such other individuals as may be elected to membership as provided in the by-laws of the corporation.

ARTICLE VI.

The provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation shall be contained in the By-Laws, as they shall be duly adopted by the board of directors of the corporation.

ARTICLE VII.
