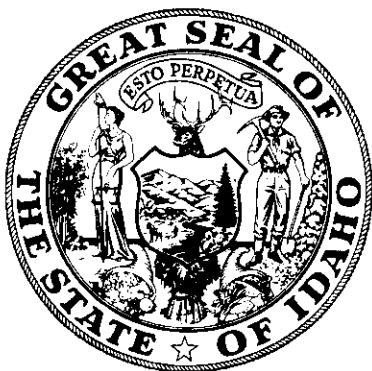

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

STATE OF IDAHO
SECRETARY OF STATE
DIXIE COMMUNITY CENTER AND CHAPEL, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned, have associated, and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation, pursuant to Title 30, Chapter 3, of the Idaho Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and do hereby make, subscribe and certify as follows:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is DIXIE COMMUNITY CENTER AND CHAPEL, INC.

ARTICLE II

The location of the registered office of the corporation shall be Dixie, Idaho, 83525, and the initial registered agent is Marion Zortman, Dixie, Idaho, 83525.

ARTICLE III

That this is a non-profit organization, no part of the income of which is distributable to its members, directors, or officers.

ARTICLE IV

The said corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE V

The purpose for which the corporation is formed are to do any or all the things hereinafter set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do in any part of the world so long as the pecuniary profit is not their object, namely:

- a. To acquire, maintain, and conduct buildings and property for a community center, club rooms, reading rooms, and educational and recreational facilities, to acquire other properties, and to construct buildings for such purposes; to engage in any and all types of activities not prohibited by law which shall promote and foster better citizenship among its members, and which shall promote and foster educational, recreational, physical, and social activities of its members and friends that they may acquire knowledge and understanding of other cultures and languages; to promote and foster mutual understanding and good will among persons of all ancestries; to engage in such activities as shall raise the standards of civic morality and community welfare through educational, recreational, and

1 social facilities, and to disseminate such knowledge as shall be use-
2 ful for its members in their work and home life and as shall make them
3 more proficient in their activities as citizens and residents of this
4 state;

- 5 b. To furnish a place of worship and a chapel in an area on the premises
6 which will always be available for meditation, worship and study;
- 7 c. To furnish, when possible, a library for the public with books,
8 magazines, and periodicals donated by interested people.
- 9 d. Any money or donations to the corporation shall be used solely to
10 promote the non-profit and charitable purposes set forth herein;
11 the corporation shall not engage in any activities precluded under
12 the Internal Revenue Code by corporations which are tax exempt, but
13 which may receive tax exempt contributions and no substantial part
14 of the activities of the corporation shall be to promote propaganda,
15 or otherwise attempt to influence legislation and the corporation shall
16 not support or oppose any candidate for public office.

17 ARTICLE VI

18 The corporation shall be non-stock and no dividends or pecun-
19 iary profits shall be declared to the members thereof. This corpora-
20 tion shall issue membership certificates to each member hereof, the
21 qualifications of being and becoming a member shall be fully set out
22 in By-Laws of this Corporation and said certificate cannot be
23 assigned except by resolution of the Board of Directors and under such
24 regulations as the By-Laws may provide.

25 ARTICLE VII

26 The general officers of the corporation shall be President,
27 Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, and the offices of
28 secretary and treasurer may be combined, and the Board of Directors
29 shall consist of three (3) members.

30 The principal duties of the officers of the corporation
31 shall be the usual and regular duties as those usually prescribed
32 for the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of
the corporation, which duties are more particularly outlined in the
laws of the State of Idaho, and will be more particularly defined
in the By-Laws herein adopted. Said officers shall perform such
additional and different duties as shall be from time to time
imposed or required by the Board of Directors or as may be prescribed
from time to time by the By-Laws. Each and every officer of this

1 corporation and member of the Board of Directors must be a member of
2 this corporation.

3 ARTICLE VIII

4 The private property of the members of the corporation shall
5 not be subject to the payment of, and no member shall be individually
6 responsible for, corporate debts or acts to any extent whatever
7 without his consent thereto in writing.

8 ARTICLE IX

9 The rights and interest of all members shall be equal and
10 no member shall have or acquire a greater interest therein than
11 any other member.

12 ARTICLE X.

13 At each election for directors every member entitled to vote
14 at such election shall have the right to vote, by person or by
15 proxy, for as many persons as there are directors to be elected
16 and for whose election he has right to vote, or, to cumulate his
17 vote by giving one (1) candidate as many votes as the number of
18 such director multiplied by his vote to equal, or by distributing
19 such votes on the same principal among any number of such
20 candidates.

21 ARTICLE XI

22 The By-Laws of the corporation may define and fix the duties
23 and responsibilities of the members and prescribe such other terms
24 and conditions upon which members shall be entitled to and retain
25 membership in the corporation inconsistent with these Articles of
26 Incorporation or the acts under which this corporation is organized.

27 ARTICLE XII

28 The names and post office addresses of the incorporation and
29 the first Board of Directors are as follows, to wit: (All whom are
30 full age citizens of the United States), Marion Zortman, Dixie,
31 Idaho; Mae Hinkley, Dixie, Idaho; and Catherine Nelson, Dixie, Idaho.
