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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
IDAHO HISPANIC POLITICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE, INC.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned, acting as the incorporators of a nonprofit corporation organized under and pursuant to the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, Chapter 30, Title 30, IDAHO CODE (“Act”), adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for the corporation identified herein.

ARTICLE I.
NAME.

The name of the Idaho nonprofit corporation organized under the Act is Idaho Hispanic Political Education Committee, Inc. (“Corporation”).

ARTICLE II.
NONPROFIT STATUS.

The Corporation is a nonprofit corporation. The Corporation shall have no net earnings incurring to the benefit of any member. The Corporation shall not engage in a regular business of a kind ordinarily carried on for profit.

ARTICLE III.
POLITICAL PURPOSE.

The Corporation is organized as a “political committee” pursuant to Chapter 66, Title 67, IDAHO CODE, and as may be amended hereafter, for the purpose of engaging in political activity as allowed by Idaho law and with respect only to state, county or local campaigns, candidates, elections, measures, and other matters of interest.

ARTICLE IV.
PERIOD OF DURATION.

The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

**ARTICLE V.
INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT.**

The mailing address of the Corporation shall be 410 Aspenwood Drive, Twin Falls, Idaho, 83301. The registered agent for the Corporation shall be Gerado Munoz Bryand. The physical address of the initial registered agent is 410 Aspenwood Drive, Twin Falls, Idaho, 83301.

**ARTICLE VI.
PURPOSES.**

The primary purpose of this Corporation is to is to engage in political and lobbying activity pursuant to and as allowed by Chapter 66, Title 67, IDAHO CODE, and as may be amended hereafter, and to engage in all other lawful activities permitted of a nonprofit corporation under Idaho law.

The Corporation is a non-partisan political education committee intended to strengthen civic participation and leadership within Idaho’s Hispanic community. The Corporation shall –

1. Work to register voters in the State of Idaho, and to educate voters on campaigns, candidates, issues and initiatives;
2. Raise money for the purpose of contributing to campaigns, candidates and measures of state, county or local concern;
3. Educate elected and appointed officials and candidates for political, administrative, executive and judicial office about the issues important to Idaho’s Hispanic community;
4. Support candidates for election to political offices, ballot measures, and petition circulation drives in the State of Idaho, the philosophies of which are consistent with advancing, promoting, and protecting interests of Idaho’s Hispanic community;
5. Oppose candidates for election to political offices, ballot measures, and petition circulation drives in the State of Idaho, the philosophies of which are contrary to, or enigmatic to, the interests of Idaho’s Hispanic community;
6. Consider and act upon all problems concerning the welfare of Idaho’s Hispanic community;
7. Do all activities necessary to, or ancillary to, promote the Mission Statement of the Corporation;
8. Do any and all things convenient and incidental to the purposes of the Corporation and generally to have and exercise all such powers as are conferred by law upon corporations of a like character.

The Corporation shall further be permitted to conduct any other lawful activity in furtherance of the goals and objectives of the Corporation. In conducting its activities, the Corporation shall at all times observe all state and local laws which may apply to political action committees in the State of Idaho.

**ARTICLE VII.
MISSION STATEMENT.**

The Mission Statement of the Corporation may be further described and set forth in the Bylaws. The Mission Statement of the Corporation includes, as a minimum, the intent of the Corporation to be an independent, non-partisan political education committee focused on education, empowerment and representation of Idaho's Hispanic community by –

- **Voter Education & Registration:**
Promoting informed voting, increasing voter registration, and helping community members better understand local and state election processes.
- **Candidate Development & Support:**
Encouraging and preparing members of our community to pursue public office—whether in city or county government, school boards, college boards, or other local positions. The Corporation will remain non-partisan while championing qualified Hispanic candidates committed to public service.
- **State Legislative Engagement:**
Facilitating education on statewide issues, legislative processes, and opportunities for community involvement at the State Capitol.
- **Civic Leadership & Community Representation:**
Providing resources, workshops, and mentorship to help individuals engage effectively in civic life.

**ARTICLE VIII.
MEMBERSHIP.**

The Corporation shall NOT have voting members.

**ARTICLE IX.
BOARD OF DIRECTORS.**

A Board of Directors shall manage the affairs of the Corporation. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less four (4) individuals. The actual number of Directors shall be fixed by the Bylaws of the Corporation. Other than the Directors constituting the initial Board of Directors, who are designated in these Articles, the qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be determined by the Bylaws of the Corporation. **ARTICLE X.
RESTRICTION ON BOARD OF DIRECTORS.**

No person not a resident of the State of Idaho, whose principal place of residence is located in the State of Idaho, shall be permitted to be a voting member of the Board of Directors of the Corporation. All voting members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall further subscribe to and agree with the purposes and mission statement of the Corporation.

**ARTICLE XI.
POLITICAL CHAIR.**

The Corporation shall at all times designate a natural person to serve as its Political Chair for the purpose of receiving political contributions and making political expenditures on behalf of the Corporation. The Bylaws shall provide for the qualifications and manner of selection of the Political Chair, and for such other duties of the Political Chair.

**ARTICLE XII.
POLITICAL TREASURER.**

The Corporation shall at all times designate a natural person to serve as its Political Treasurer for the purpose of fulfilling the duties of a "political treasurer" as set forth in Chapter 66, Title 67, IDAHO CODE, and as may be amended hereafter. The Bylaws shall provide for the qualifications and manner of selection of the Political Treasurer, and for such other duties of the Political Treasurer.

**ARTICLE XIII.
BYLAWS.**

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the Corporation shall be set forth in

the Bylaws. The initial Bylaws of the Corporation may be adopted by a numerical majority of those persons constituting the initial members of the Board of Directors. Thereafter, the Bylaws may be amended in such manner and method as shall be set forth in the Bylaws.

**ARTICLE XIV.
DISTRIBUTION ON DISSOLUTION.**

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation, distribute all of the assets of the Corporation to an established and then-existing nonprofit organization in the State of Idaho with a purpose and mission comparable to that of the Corporation. Any such assets not so distributed shall be distributed by the district court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations, as such court shall determine to be consistent with the purposes of the Corporation.

**ARTICLE XV.
INCORPORATOR.**


