**IDAHO HUNGER ACTION COUNCIL
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

IDAHO HUNGER ACTION COUNCIL is a statewide nonprofit membership organization working on issues of hunger and poverty and being an advocate for the poor. This is done by empowering low-income people, building bridges between economic classes, educating the public on hunger and poverty issues, and developing and implementing effective public and private service programs.

Current priorities for IHAC are the Campaign to End Childhood Hunger in Idaho (emphasizing improved access to public child nutrition programs), health care, affordable housing and improvement in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.

The Council is governed by a Board of Directors that must be at least 51% low-income. Low-income chapters in the Lewiston, Boise and Idaho Falls areas each elect two of their strongest leaders to be Board members. Low-income Board members who are leaders in local low-income groups, such as Head Start Policy Councils, are recruited to join the Board from regions without active chapters. The members may also elect up to five at-large members with special expertise or experience.

The Board is legally responsible for IHAC policies and programs and how IHAC raises and spends its money. Board members participate in developing budgets and in fundraising.

IHAC's Board meets every two months, in Boise, usually on a Friday night and Saturday or all day Saturday. IHAC reimburses Board members for mileage (18 cents a mile) and babysitting if needed (\$1 an hour up to \$10 per day). Lodging is provided for any Board member traveling more than 60 miles for an extended Board meeting. Meals are usually provided.

IHAC's annual meeting is a potluck supper on Friday, October 2, at 6:00 p.m., at First Presbyterian Church, 9th & State Streets, Boise. At this meeting a new Board will be elected, a change in the By-Laws voted on, and priorities for the coming year discussed. A brief Board meeting will elect officers and an Executive Committee and set an orientation meeting for November.

On Saturday, October 3rd, IHAC is sponsoring the Harvest Hunger Festival at Julia Davis Park in Boise. All members are urged to help with this Festival.
