ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF YANKEE SILVER MINES, LTD.

KENNETH D. MONTEE and JAMES L. AUBERT, being each over the age of twenty-one (21) years of age and citizens of the United States of America, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Idaho Business Corporation Act, adopt the following articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be YANKEE SILVER MINES, INC.

ARTICLE II

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The purpose for which this corporation is organized is the transaction of any or all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the Idaho Business Corporation Act.

ARTICLE IV

This corporation shall have the authority to issue ten million (10,000,000) shares of capital stock of the par value of \$0.05 per share. There shall be no other class or shares of stock in this corporation.

ARTICLE V

The owners of shares of stock of this corporation shall not be entitled to preemptive rights to subscribe for or purchase any part of new or additional issues of stock or securities convertible into stock of any class whatsoever whether now or hereafter authorized, and whether issued for cash, property, services, by way of dividends, or otherwise.

ARTICLE VI

The board of directors shall have full power to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal the bylaws or adopt new bylaws. Nothing herein shall deny the concurrent power of the shareholders to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal the bylaws.

ARTICLE VII

This corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change, or repeal any provisions contained in its articles of incorporation in any manner now or hereafter prescribed or permitted by statute. All rights of shareholders of this corporation are granted subject to this reservation.

ARTICLE VIII

The address of the registered office of this corporation is 2107 Burke Road, (P.O. Box 1) Wallace, Idaho 83873, and the name of its registered agent at such address is James L. Aubert.

ARTICLE IX

The number, qualifications, terms of office, manner of election, time and place of meetings, and powers and duties of the

directors shall be prescribed in the bylaws, but the number of the first directors shall be two (2), and they shall serve until the first meeting of shareholders and until their successors are elected and qualified, and their names and post office addresses are as follows:
