ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
HAGADONE NEWSPAPERS SERVICE CO.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that we, the undersigned, Bradley F. Henke, D. C. Dahlgren and T. E. Deaton, each of whom is a citizen of the United States and of full age, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the general incorporation laws of the State of Idaho and do make and execute and adopt in triplicate the following Articles of Incorporation, to wit:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be "HAGADONE
NEWSPAPERS SERVICE CO."

ARTICLE II

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To engage in the business of providing management and accounting services to newspapers, printers, publishers, booksellers, bookbinders, papermakers, stationers, engravers, photographers, photographic printers, stereotypers, electrotypers, lithographers, machinists, mechanical engineers, ink manufacturers, radio stations, television stations and any other business that may seem expedient and generally to perform such acts and to do all things deemed necessary to engage in the business of providing such services.

2. To carry on business as proprietors and publishers of newspapers, journals, magazines, books and other literary works and undertakings; to carry on business as printers, booksellers, bookbinders, papermakers, stationers, engravers, photographers, photographic printers, stereotypers, electrotypers,

lithographers, machinists, mechanical engineers and ink manufacturers, or any other business or manufacture that may seem expedient.

3. To print, publish and sell books, newspapers, journals, magazines, periodicals, lists, pamphlets and reports for the dissemination of current and general architectural, engineering, construction and building trade news, notices and information throughout the business world.

4. To carry on the business of printers, engravers, publishers, book and print sellers, bookbinders and art journalists, in all their branches; to carry on the business of newspaper and magazine proprietors, news agents, journalists, literature agents and stationers, in all their branches; to carry on the business of manufacturers and distributors of and dealers in engravings, prints, pictures, drawings and any written, engraved, painted or printed products, in all their branches.

5. To engage in commercial radio broadcasting in all phases, including all types of electronic transfer of sound or visual signals and all means of radio or electronic broadcast as the same now exist or may be hereafter developed and to do all things in respect to all allied electronic arts, including the manufacture of radio and electronic apparatus, the distribution of the same, and all related or allied arts.

6. To engage in radio broadcasting, including particularly the conduct of commercial radio broadcasting in all forms permitted by law, including the operation of commercial radio stations, television stations, and all types of radio transmission of entertainment, information, knowledge or advertising, including the transmission of facsimile newspapers or other publications, and to do all acts and things usual and customary in

the conduct of radio broadcasting in all its forms as the same may exist at this time or in the future.

7. To lease, hold, purchase and convey all such real and personal property as may be necessary to carry on any of the company's business, as well as such real and personal property as it may be necessary to acquire in the enforcement or settlement of any claims or demands arising out of the business transactions or affairs of the company.

8. To subscribe for, purchase, invest in, acquire, hold, own, assign, transfer, pledge and otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock of any corporation or corporations engaged in any business or businesses similar to those which this corporation may engage in, and to issue, execute and deliver in exchange therefor stocks, bonds, mortgages, notes or other obligations of this corporation, and to exercise in respect to the said shares of stocks, bonds and other securities any and all of the powers, rights and privileges of individual ownership, including the right to vote.

9. To acquire by purchase, lease, appropriation or otherwise and to hold, enjoy, use, bargain, sell, lease, hire, rent, exchange, mortgage, encumber, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of and deal in all classes of personal property of every kind and nature, whether as manufacturer, wholesaler, retailer or otherwise.

10. To enter into and make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and description made for any lawful purpose, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association or corporation either public or private, or with any municipality, county, state, territory, colony, province, nation, government or agency of sub-division thereof.

11. To generally carry out the business for which this corporation is organized and to perform any and all things requisite therefor, to the same extent and with like effect as though each power herein were specifically set forth at length.

ARTICLE III

The time of existence of this corporation shall be in perpetuity.

ARTICLE IV

The office and principal place of business and the registered office of this corporation shall be at Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai County, Idaho, c/o Duane B. Hagadone, Hagadone Building, 3rd at Sherman, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, 83814.

ARTICLE V

The capital stock of this corporation shall consist of one thousand (1,000) shares of Common Stock, each of a par value of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). The aggregate par value of said shares is the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). Each share shall be entitled to one vote. The paid-in capital of the corporation and the amount with which it will begin business shall be the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00); said amount to be paid either in cash or with other property tangible or intangible, or with necessary services actually rendered to the corporation at a fair valuation.

ARTICLE VI

The number of directors of this corporation shall at the commencement of business be five (5), but the Board of Directors may at any time, by amendment of the By-Laws, be increased to any number not exceeding nine (9) or decreased to any number not less than three (3).

The first Board of Directors shall consist of:
