I, ARNOLD WILLIAMS, Secretary of State of the State of Idaho, and legal custodian of the corporation records of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify that the original of the articles of incorporation of

THE BOISE UNITARIAN FELLOWSHIP, INC.

was filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the **Fifteenth** day
of **May** **A. D. One Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-one** and
is duly recorded on Film No. **114** of Record of Domestic Corporations, of the State
of Idaho, and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Section 30-103 and
Sections 30-1001 to 30-1005, inclusive, Idaho Code.

I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and
successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name hereinbefore stated, for
perpetual existence from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at

Boise in the County of **Ada**,
and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Non-Profit Cooperative
Associations as provided in Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

- of -

THE BOISE UNITARIAN FELLOWSHIP, INC.

4 WE, the undersigned natural persons, each over the age of
5 21 years, acting as incorporators of a non-profit co-operative
6 association, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 10, Title 30
7 of the Idaho Code, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation
8 for the Boise Unitarian Fellowship, Inc.:

I

10 The name of the co-operative association shall be, and
11 is, The Boise Unitarian Fellowship, Inc.

II

The period of its duration shall be, and is, perpetual.

III

15 The purposes for which the co-operative association is
16 organized are:

17 A. To bring freethinkers into closer acquaintance and
18 cooperation in order that they may deepen and strengthen one
19 another in the study and practice of ethical religion, in the
20 furtherance of individual freedom of belief, in promoting the
21 democratic process in human relations, in the development of their
22 children, in diffusing knowledge of Unitarianism and the furtherance
23 of its principles, and to give, as a group, such expression to
24 their convictions as the fellowship decides.

25 B. To affirm the right and obligation of the individual
26 to develop his own concept of the nature and destiny of man and
27 the universe and to formulate principles to govern the conduct of
28 his own life and his relations with others.

29 C. To have and maintain a denominational affiliation
30 with, and be a member of, the American Unitarian Association and
31 such Regional Conference thereof as may have jurisdiction in this
32 locality.

1 D. To establish and maintain schools and other
2 educational institutions, and to educate and inform the membership
3 of the association and the public generally concerning the principles
4 of the association.

5 E. To carry on any and all activities within the scope
6 and purpose of this association.

7 F. To lease, rent, purchase, own, pledge, mortgage,
8 hypothecate, sell, and convey such personal and real property in
9 the name of the association as may be necessary in the management
10 or operation of the affairs of the association.

11 IV

12 Membership certificates shall be issued to each member
13 of this association and the rights and interests of all members
14 shall be equal.

15 V

16 The membership of this co-operative association shall
17 be determined by rules, regulations, and by-laws thereof.

18 VI

19 The Board of Directors shall consist of five (5)
20 members, two (2) of whom shall also be the president and the
21 vice-president, and each of the directors shall serve for a term
22 of one year. In all elections, each member of the association
23 shall have one vote.

24 VII

25 The method of operation and the regulation of the
26 business of this co-operative association shall be governed by the
27 by-laws of the association and shall be under the control of the
28 Board of Directors.

29 VIII

30 The address of the initial registered office of this
31 co-operative association is 6720 Overland Street, Boise, Idaho.
