ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

 \mathbf{OF}

HARNEY INDUSTRIES, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, all being of full age and citizens of the United States, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho.

And we hereby certify in writing:

I.

That the name of said corporation shall be "HARNEY INDUSTRIES, INC."

II.

That the purposes for which said corporation is formed are:

- (1) To carry on business as wholesalers, retailers and manufacturers of goods, wares, merchandise, and personal property of every class and description, particularly any and all types of building materials and component parts thereof, whether made in whole or in part from wood, metal, plastic, clay, stone, building blocks, composition, or any other substance whatsoever; and to hold, own, sell or otherwise dispose of, trade, deal in and deal with the same; and to purchase, own, lease, and deal in real property of all kinds.
- (2) In furtherance and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the laws of the State of Idaho and by the principles of the common law upon corporations organized under the provisions of law authorizing the formation of this corporation, and of the purposes and powers hereinbefore stated, the corporation shall also have the following purposes and powers, it being expressly provided that the enumeration of specific powers shall not be construed to limit or restrict in any manner the aforesaid general powers of the corporation:
 - (a) To own, lease, and operate sawmills; to purchase, manufacture, and sell lumber, brick, pumice, stone and other

building materials; to build and repair homes and other structures; and to conduct a hardware and mercantile business in connection with said operation.

- (b) To carry on all or any of the businesses of manufacturers and dealers and workers in cement and other kindred substances, lime, plaster, whiting, clay, gravel, sand, minerals, earth, stone, coal, fuel, pumice, artificial stone, and builders' hardware, and requisites and conveniences of all kinds.
- (c) To carry on a general contracting business, and to excavate, grade, and construct sewers, bridges, buildings, highways and public and private works of all kinds; to construct, alter, decorate, furnish, set up, and improve buildings of every sort and kind; and to make and to execute contracts for all kinds of construction work.
- (d) To do a general, electric, contracting, construction and engineering business; and to buy, sell, and deal in supplies, machinery, appliances, and apparatus used in and about said business.
- (e) To manufacture, buy and sell furniture, including office and store fixtures, devices, partitions, improvements, and other similar articles; and to engage in the installation, alteration and repair thereof.
- (f) To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in glass in all forms, including glassware, glass ornaments, cut glass, structural glass, water guage glasses, water guage protectors, and appliances, lamps, shades, bottles, bulbs, reflectors, and articles of commerce of a similar character made of glass or glass in composition with other materials.
- (g) To carry on a general hardware business, including the purchase and sale of all kinds of hardware and wholesale and retail; and to lease, buy, hold, and sell all such property, real or personal, as may be necessary to the prosecution of said business.
 - (h) To purchase, manufacture and sell heaters, stoves,

- wire and steelware and articles of commerce of similar character.
- To manufacture from any kind of metals, wood, or other material, or combination of materials, any and all kinds of castings, implements, tools, fixtures and machinery and any other articles of commerce ordinarily made in a thoroughly equipped machine shop and foundry; to purchase and sell the same; and to manufacture, purchase and sell woodworking machinery, tools, and appliances.
- (k) To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in all kinds of hardware, iron, steel, wire, rods, tinplate and nails; to manufacture, purchase and sell paints, varnishes, oils, fillers, stains, colors, enamels, waterproofing coating, and compounds, mortar and cement stains and coatings, putty, glass and other supplies for painters.
- To manufacture, buy, and sell paper and paperboards of every kind and description and the supplies used in the manufacture thereof; and to manufacture, buy, and sell paper goods, boxes, labels, specialties, and novelties made of paper.
- (m) To own and operate saw and planing mills, manufacture furniture, and other products of wood; to own timber land; to engage in logging operations; and to do all business pertaining to these enterprises.
- (n) To purchase, mine, quarry, cut, saw, crush, finish, set and dress stone, marble, pumice and other materials; and to sell the same to the public.
- (o) To purchase, hold, sell, improve and lease real estate, and mortgage and encumber the same; and to erect, manage, care

for and maintain, extend and alter buildings thereon.

- (p) To acquire the goodwill, rights, property and assets of all kinds and undertake the whole or any part of the liabilities, of any person, firm, association or corporation on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, and to pay for the same in cash, stocks, bonds, debentures, or other securities of this corporation, or otherwise; and to acquire and take all or any part of the business assets and liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation.
- To lend money and negotiate loans; to draw, accept, endorse, discount, sell, and deliver bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, obligations, securities of any government or authority or company; to form, promote, subsidize, and assist companies, firms, and partnerships of all kinds; to act as surety and guarantor in any and all types of engagements, including the power to execute, endorse and deliver contracts to guarantee the prompt and faithful performance and payment of debts, notes, agreements, contracts, and undertakings of any other person, firm, partnership or corporation; and including also the power to act as an accommodation, co-maker, or guarantor of obligations, either as a primary or secondary obligor; to enter into any arrangements with any authorities, municipal, local, or otherwise, conducive to the company's objects or any of them; and to obtain from such government or authority, any rights, privileges, and concessions which the company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise, and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions. Generally to carry on and undertake any business, undertaking, transaction, or operation commonly carried on or undertaken by merchants or manufacturers, or which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the company's property or rights.

- (3) Without in any particular limiting or restricting any of the objects and powers of the corporation, it is hereby expressly declared and provided that the corporation shall have the power to issue bonds and other obligations and shares of its capital stock in payment for property purchased by it, or for any other lawful object in and about its business; to mortgage or pledge any stocks, bonds, or other obligations, or any property which may be acquired by it; to secure any bonds, guarantees, or other obligations by it issued or incurred; to guarantee any dividends, or bonds or contracts, or other obligations.
- (4) Any and all of the rights, powers, privileges, or restrictions in these Articles of Incorporation granted and contained, conferred or imposed, may be enlarged, amended, altered, or changed in any manner and to any extent, or repealed by articles of amendment, made, executed, authorized and filed in any manner now or hereafter permitted or authorized by the laws of the State of Idaho.
- (5) The general clauses contained in this statement of purposes shall be construed as both purposes and powers, and the statements contained in each clause, shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in no way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clause, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers.

 That the corporation shall have perpetual existence.

IV.

That the registered office of said corporation in the State of Idaho shall be located in Kimberly, Twin Falls County, State of Idaho, and that the post office address of the registered office of said corporation in the State of Idaho is Kimberly, Idaho.

V.

That the amount of the capital stock of said corporation shall be \$250,000.00, divided into 250,000 shares of par value of \$1.00 each, and that the total authorized number of shares shall be 250,000, and their aggregate par value \$250,000.00.
