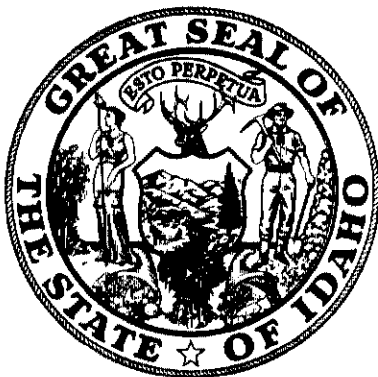
**CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, a natural person acting as an incorporator in order to form a Corporation under the provisions of the Idaho Business Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

Article 1. Name. The name of the Corporation is HOME SERVICES REFERRAL, INC.

Article 2. Purposes and Objects. The purposes and objects for which the Corporation is formed are:

(a) To offer the sales of contracts, advertising, promotion, products and supplies, training, and all related services required by clients of the Corporation and to perform any and all acts ancillary or necessary thereto.

(b) To sue and be sued, complain and defend, in its corporate name.

(c) To have a corporate seal which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or in any other manner reproduced.

(d) To purchase, take, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated.

(e) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, transfer and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.

(f) To lend money and use its credit to assist its employees.

(g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign Corporations, associations, partnerships, or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.

(h) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at rates of interest as the Corporation may determine, issue it's notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of it's obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of it's property, franchises and income.

(i) To lend money for it's corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.

(j) To conduct it's business, carry on it's operations and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this act, within or without this state.

(k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the Corporation, and define their duties and fix their compensation.

(l) To make and alter By-Laws, not inconsistent with it's Articles of Incorporation or with the laws of this state, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the Corporation.

(m) To make donations or the public welfare or for charitable, scientific or educational purposes.

(n) To transact any lawful business which the Board of Directors shall find will be in aid of governmental policy.

(o) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trusts, profit sharing plans, stock bonus plans, and other incentive plans for any or all of it's Directors, officers, and employees.

(p) To be a promoter, partner, member, associate, or manager of any partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

(q) To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

The foregoing clauses are to be construed both as objects and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that enumeration herein of specific objects and powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers of the Corporation; provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be deemed to authorize and permit the Corporation to carry on any business or to exercise any power or to do any act which a Corporation formed under the Act hereinbefore referred to, or any amendment thereof or supplement thereto, or substitute therefore, may not at the time lawfully carry on or do. It is the intention that the purposes, inclusive, of paragraph Second of these Articles of Incorporation shall, except as otherwise expressly provided, and in no way be limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from, the terms of any other subparagraph, clause or paragraph of these Articles of Incorporation.

Article 3. Duration. The Corporation is to have perpetual existence.

Article 4. Registered Office and Agent. The location and street address of the initial Registered Office of the Corporation is 675 South Linder, Meridian, Idaho 83642. The initial Registered Agent of the Corporation shall be John C. Waddington who conducts business at the above address.

Article 5. Aggregate Shares. The aggregate number of shares which the Corporation shall have the authority to issue is 10,000 shares, said shares to be without par value.

Article 6. Incorporator. The name and post office address of the incorporator is as follows:

Article 7. Initial Directors. The number of Directors constituting the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be 3 and may be increased to twelve by Board action. The names and post office addresses of the initial Directors, who are to serve until the first annual meeting of the Stockholders and until their successors are elected and shall qualify, are as follows:

Article 8. Preemptive Rights. Stockholders of the Corporation shall have preemptive and preferential rights of subscription to any shares of stock of the Corporation whether now or hereafter authorized or to any obligations convertible to stock of the Corporation and any such stock or obligation issued by the Corporation shall first be offered to the Stockholders of the Corporation.

Article 9. Amendment of Articles and By-Laws. The initial By-Laws of the Corporation shall be adopted by the majority of the Board of Directors. A majority of the Board of Directors or shareholders shall have the power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws

or adopt new By-Laws. The Corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, or repeal these Articles of Incorporation in the manner prescribed by law, by the majority vote of the Stockholders.
