AND I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name stated in the articles, and for perpetual existence from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at Craignont, in the County of Lewis, and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Religious, Ex-Service Men, Benevolent, Charitable and Fraternal Corporations, as provided in Chapter 11, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

CRAIGMONT JAY-C-ETTES, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, the undersigned, being all of legal age and citizens of the United States of America, have voluntarily associated ourselves and do upon the date of these presents, hereby voluntarily associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation of social, educational, benevolent and charitable character under the laws of the State of Idaho, and we do hereby adopt and certify the following Articles of Incorporation, to-wit:

Article 1.

The name of this corporation shall be "Craigmont Jay-C-Ettes, Inc."

Article II.

The location and post office address of the registered office, and the place where the principal business of said corporation is to be transacted, is Craigmont, Lewis County, State of Idaho.

Article III.

The duration and term of existence of this corporation shall be perpetual.

Article IV.

In furtherance, and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the laws of the State of Idaho, this corporation shall have the following objects, purposes and powers:

To provide its members a medium for training in citizenship and public service work, to advance the educational, civic, social, commercial, welfare and economic interests of the Village of Craigmont, Lewis County, Idaho, and the general welfare and prosperity of its adjacent and tributary areas; to promote integrity and good faith, just and equitable principles in business and professional activity; to cooperate with the Craigmont Junior Chamber of Commerce, the Craigmont Chamber of Commerce, or any other organization or individual in advancing

its program of usefulness to the local community, state and nation; to have a part as representing the said area in the consideration and decision of public policy in municipal, county, state and national affairs.

To provide a suitable place for the meeting of its members, the establishment of facilities for educational, civic, social, commercial, economic, welfare and political research, including social and recreational features, so as to sustain enterest in the members and secure intelligent action on the part of its boards and committees in the accomplishment of its general purposes.

To acquire, hold, own, use, lease, let, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, sell or otherwise dispose of all manner of real or personal property whatsoever that may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect any one or more of the objects of this corporation.

To make and enter into all necessary contracts and agreements, to borrow money, to lend money, to evidence the indebtedness of the corporation by notes, bonds or other instruments and to secure the same by pledge, mortgage, trust deed or other instruments and to do all acts, and to make, execute and deliver all necessary instruments for the carrying out of the purposes of this corporation; to acquire and own the stock, bonds and securities of other corporations while owning the same to exercise all the privileges of ownership consistent with the corporate character of this corporation.

To act either as, or by and through principals, agents, attorneys, trustees, contractors, factors, lessors, lessees or otherwise, either alone or in connection with others; to do any and all things convenient and incidental to the purposes herein expressed, and generally to have and exercise all powers as are by law conferred on corporations of like character, without in any particular limiting any of the powers or purposes of the corporation, and in connection with its objects to do any and all things and to exercise any and all powers not prohibited by law.

Article V.

This corporation is not organized for profit and shall have no capital stock.

Article VI.

The conditions and regulations of membership and the rights and

privileges of members shall be determined and fixed by the By-Laws.

Article VII.

The private property of the members shall not be subject to the payment of the corporate debts, liabilities or obligations to any extent whatever.

Article VIII.

The number of directors of this corporation shall be not less than three nor more than ten as set from time to time in the By-Laws of the Corporation. The Board of Directors shall have the management of the real and personal property of this corporation, the Directors' qualifications and terms of office, manner of election (except the first Board of Directors which was elected as herein set forth), time, place and manner of calling meetings and other powers and duties of the Directors shall be prescribed by the By-Laws.

Article IX.

The officers of this corporation shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Reporter, and such other officers as may be provided by the By-Laws, and their qualifications, terms of office, manner of election, time, place and manner of calling meetings and other powers and duties shall be prescribed by the By-Laws.

Article X.

Article XI.

A duly called meeting of the members of the Craigmont Jay-C-Ettes was held at the office of Robert C. Strom, Attorney at Law, at Craigmont, Lewis County, State of Idaho, on the 29th day of August, 1960, at the hour of 9:00 o'clock P.M. at which meeting a marjority of the members present voted for the election of Directors; notice of the time and place of holding such meeting and election was given by the publication thereof, for three weeks prior to the said meeting, in the Lewis County Herald, a newspaper of general circulation in Lewis County, published at Nezperce, Lewis County, Idaho, and also by posting a like notice in a conspicuous place on the building where such election was held for the same length of time immediately preceding such election, said notice being posted at the said office of Robert C. Strom on the 11th day of August, 1960, and remaining posted therein to and including the said 29th day of August, 1960. That at said meeting the following persons were duly elected Directors of this corporation, by unanimous vote of the members present at such meeting as follows:

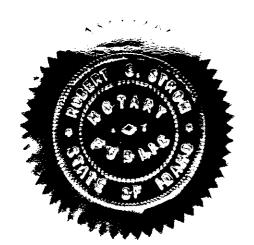
