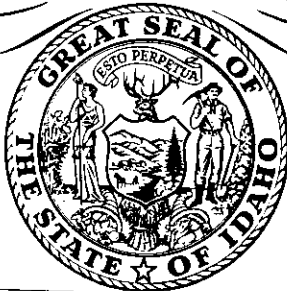

AMERICAN OVERSEAS, INC. : do hereby, do undertake, contract and agree with the Board of Directors of the United States of America, in order to secure a corporation for the purposes herein-after stated pursuant to the laws of the State of Ohio, to hereby signify as follows:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be "AMERICAN OVERSEAS, INC."

ARTICLE II

The purpose of the corporation for which the corporation is formed is:

1. To acquire in the United States, foreign countries, or otherwise dealing or trading in furniture, and fixtures, fixtures, furniture, and other articles of goods, wares and merchandise.
2. To acquire, manufacture, buy and sell, lease, and sublease, window shades, curtains, valances, and draperies, table covers, cloth covers, linings or cloths, beds and other devices for window draperies.
3. To manufacture and sell chairs, furniture, sofas, settees, benches, and also cushions, brass and iron for the same, and also panels for decorative and other purposes.
4. To manufacture, buy, sell or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds and descriptions.
5. To engage in any business, according to business and to enter into contracts for the acquisition of interior decorating services, furniture, fixtures, appliances, and equipment of all kinds.
6. To borrow money and secure same loans either with or without security or on the security of real or personal property; to issue, accept, endorse, buy and sell discounts and negotiable bills of exchange, notes, drafts, letters, checks or notes and acceptance of all kinds, and to receive and hold same; to accept as security

to acquire, hold, lease, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property.

4. To acquire, manage, work, develop, lease, mortgage, sell, dispose of and on various real with interest, of all kind, including consideration of maintenance of the same, acquire and obtain of all kinds; to acquire, finance, develop and in various other ways, conduct business of corporations.

5. To execute, lease, make and carry out contracts of every sort and kind with any person, firm, or institution or corporation.

6. To acquire, own, hold and dispose of profits, concessions and franchises or interests therein.

7. To appoint agents, attorneys and a license and to enter into all necessary contracts with agents, subagents, collectors and lenders.

8. To receive, acquire, hold, purchase or dispose of, convey, mortgage and/or lease real and personal property; to dispose of, sell, lease, assign, transfer, mortgage and/or convey any rights, privileges, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation other than its franchise of business concession, and to receive, purchase, guarantee, hold, mortgage, own, vote, sell, lease and/or otherwise dispose of or deal in shares, bonds, securities and debentures and other evidences or indebtedness of other corporations, domestic or foreign.

9. To enter into contracts, obligations of any type or kind essential, necessary or proper to the transaction of its ordinary affairs or for the purposes of the corporation.

10. To acquire by purchase or otherwise and hold, own, sell, convey, encumber and transfer all kinds of real and personal property of every kind and description required in connection with the conduct of the business of the company.

11. To borrow money or otherwise incur indebtedness without limit as to amount and to draw, make, accept, endorse, transfer, guarantee, execute and issue bonds, debentures, notes, checks, drafts, bills of exchange, negotiable instruments and all other instruments

capital stock, but such stock so acquired and held shall not be entitled to vote or to receive dividends.

2. To have, exercise and enjoy all the powers now or hereafter granted to corporations organized under the laws of the State of Idaho and particularly all of the powers and privileges granted to corporations by Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Idaho Code relating to the right of foreign individuals to transact business, and to do any act or thing necessary or convenient for the prosecution of the aforesaid business, and/or carrying it to effect in and out of the aforesaid objects and powers.

3. All of the foregoing provisions of this article shall be construed with its objects and powers, and it is hereby expressly provided that the enumeration herein of specific objects and powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any way the general powers of the corporation; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize or permit the corporation to carry on its business or to exercise any power or to do any act which corporations formed under the laws of Idaho now or hereafter existing, may now or hereafter lawfully carry on or do. It is the intention with the aforesaid objects and powers specified in each of the foregoing of this Article II of the Articles of Incorporation shall, even if not so specified, in no wise be limited or restricted by reference to or inference drawn from any other articles or portions of this charter as contained in or by any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, and it is the intention that the aforesaid objects and powers specified in these Articles of Incorporation shall be treated as independent purposes, objects and powers.

ARTICLE III

1. The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE IV

1. The office of the sole officer and director of the registered office of the corporation shall be the City of Montello, Blaine County, Idaho.
