ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE ALACCA BIBLE CONFERENCE ASSOCIATION
OF LEWISTON, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, all of whom are natural persons of full age and citizens of the United States of America, do hereby voluntarily associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho; and we do hereby execute, acknowledge and adopt these Articles of Incorporation in triplicate, certifying as follows:

ARTICLE I.

NAME: The name of said corporation is and shall be "THE ALACCA BIBLE CONFERENCE ASSOCIATION OF LEWISTON, INC."

ARTICLE II.

PURPOSES: The purposes for which said corporation is formed and organized are:

To build, maintain and operate Bible Conference Grounds, and to carry out all other operations and activities common to such organizations and to generally perform the services and operations incidental to the conduct of such an organization.

To carry out such purposes, such corporation shall have the following powers, which powers shall not be exclusive, but such corporation shall have all other lawful powers not inconsistent therewith, to-wit:

To have, hold, lease, use, purchase and take possession of and enjoy in fee simple and otherwise any real or personal property necessary for the uses and purposes of the corporation as above set forth, and to sell, lease, deed in trust, alienate, mortgage or dispose of the same at the pleasure of

the corporation and for the uses and purposes for which said corporation is formed, and to buy and sell, rent or lease, real or personal property and to apply the proceeds of sale, including any and all income to the uses and purposes of the corporation;

To accept real or personal property, money, bond or other personal property, whether by bequest or otherwise, for the purposes of carrying out the objects of this corporation, and to exercise all the rights and privileges allowed or permitted to any and all other religious organizations under the laws of the State of Idaho.

ARTICLE III.

DURATION: Said corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE IV.

LOCATION OF PRINCIPAL OFFICE: The location and post office address of the principal and registered office of said corporation shall be at Lewiston, Nez Perce County, State of Idaho.

ARTICLE V.

The corporation is one which does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof, and it is organized solely for non-profit purposes. Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation or corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious and/or scientific purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. If this corporation holds any assets on trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such a manner as may be directed by decree of the superior court of the county in which this corporation's principal office is located, upon petition

by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

ARTICLE VI.

NUMBER OF DIRECTORS OR TRUSTEES: The ALACCA Bible

Conference Association of Lewiston, Inc. conducted its meeting to elect directors at 2:00 o'clock P.M., November 13, 1966, at 316 - 12th Avenue, Lewiston, Idaho, following publication of the notice of said election in the Lewiston Morning Tribune, a daily newspaper published in Lewiston, Idaho, for a period of two weeks. It was determined by a majority of the members attending said meeting that the number of directors of the ALACCA Bible Conference Association of Lewiston, Inc. will be nine (9), and the names and addresses of the persons duly elected by a majority vote of those members in attendance, to serve until the election of their successors, are as follows:
