AND I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name stated in the articles, and for **perpetual existence** from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at **Moscow, Idaho** in the County of **Latah**

and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Religious, Ex-Service Men, Benevolent, Charitable and Fraternal Corporations, as provided in Chapter 11, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
WASHINGTON-IDAHO SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION

That we, the undersigned, all of whom are natural persons of full age, bona fide residents of the State of Idaho, and two-thirds of whom are citizens of the United States, associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit, social and benevolent corporation under the provisions of Chapter 11, Title 30, Idaho Code, amendatory and supplemental thereto, and we do certify and declare as follows:

ARTICLE I

That the name of the corporation shall be WASHINGTON-IDAHO SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE II

That the objects and purpose for and which this corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To promote performances of the Washington-Idaho Symphony Association for the region on a non-profit basis.
2. To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, convey, mortgage, and/or lease, real and personal property; to dispose of, sell, lease, assign, transfer, mortgage and/or convey any rights, privilege, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation, other than its franchise of being a corporation.
3. To enter into contracts or obligations of any type or kind essential, necessary or proper to the transaction of its ordinary affairs, or for the purposes of the corporation.

ARTICLE III

That the existence of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

That the principal and registered office for the transaction of the business of this corporation is to be located at

861 Harold Avenue, Moscow, Idaho .

ARTICLE V

That this corporation shall have no capital stock and shall be composed of members rather than shareholders in accordance with the foregoing provisions. That the corporation is one which does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to any member thereof and is organized for objects and purposes hereinbefore set forth.

ARTICLE VI

That the membership of the corporation shall consist of the signatories to these articles of incorporation and such other persons as may from time to time decide to become members by paying the membership dues in compliance with the by-laws of the corporation to be adopted.

ARTICLE VII

That in accordance with Idaho Code 30-1102, on the 21st day of November, 1972, at 7:00 o'clock, p.m., at 861 Harold Avenue, in the County of Latah, State of Idaho, an election was held to elect a board of directors of this corporation. Among those members present at said meeting a majority thereof voted the following board of directors into office.



That a meeting of all members of the association known as the Washington-Idaho Symphony Association was called to take place at 861 Harold Avenue, in the City of Moscow, County of Latah, State of Idaho, on the 21st day of November, 1972, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock, p.m., That a notice of said meeting was posted at least two (2) weeks prior to said meeting in a conspicuous place of said building and was published once a week for three weeks in The Daily Idahonian, prior to the appointed day of said meeting.

That on said date, at the aforesaid hour, a majority of the members of the association known as the Washington-Idaho Symphony Association were present and the meeting was called to order for the purposes as set forth in the posted and published notice of organizing the Washington-Idaho Symphony Association, a corporation, and for the purpose of electing directors thereof.

That R. J. Strobel presided and Elaine Koomds was the secretary elect.

Upon a motion, duly made and seconded, it was unanimously passed by those present that the Washington-Idaho Symphony Association be incorporated under the laws of the State of Idaho as a non-profit, social, and benevolent corporation. That thereafter by motion duly made, seconded and unanimously passed, the incorporators set forth in the Articles of Incorporation, to which this certificate is hereto attached, were duly elected by unanimous vote to be directors of said corporation.


