

# Articles of Incorporation

of the

KOOTENAI RAILROAD COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that we the undersigned  
a majority of an Idaho, long side residents and freemen  
within the State of Idaho do hereby associate ourselves  
together for the purpose of forming a corporation and to file  
and for the purpose of creating and organizing ourselves  
into a body, politic and corporate in fact and in name.  
to be hereinafter, executive, deliberative, judicial, and might  
have articles of incorporation statutory as follows to wit,-

## Article First.

The name of this corporation is the

**KOOTENAI RAILROAD COMPANY.**

## Article Second.

The place for the organization of said  
corporation, consisting, equal, established and organized in  
conditions described below and a "Long's" line, and in  
consequence, shall appoint a line between the British  
 Columbia Railroads Company and near the town of Joy, in  
the State of Idaho to meet with the Kootenai  
River to a point at or near Long's Ferry, Idaho Northern  
Idaho, and deliver to the boundary line between the State  
of Idaho and the Province of British Columbia; together with  
a line's line from a point near Long's Ferry above named  
in the Kootenai River to the Idaho boundary thence up the  
Kootenai River in an easterly and northerly direction  
through the State of Montana to the international boundary

line. The said Railroad to be constructed in a substantial and workmanlike manner with all the necessary dams, culverts, bridges, viaducts, embankments, turnouts, stations and watering places and all other appurtenances including furnishing, rolling stock and equipment the same to be equal in all respects to be sufficient on the first class.

Also to construct, use, and maintain elevators, ware houses, freight houses, depots buildings, station houses, machine shops, round houses, engine houses, offices, dwelling houses, docks, dry docks, piers, wharves, inclines, canals, locks, reservoirs, tanks, coal and ore bunkers and all other buildings, machinery, superstructures or substructures, and all such accommodations and facilities as may be necessary to properly operate and maintain said railroad and telegraph line.

Also to locate points, lay out roads, and secure land by purchases or otherwise for the use of the agents or proprietors.

Also to build, purchase, own, hire, and let to all, maintain and operate upon the entire of the aforesaid line, all or any of the rivers, streams and courses of water adjacent to said or thereof and tributaries, or their tributaries, located, situated, built, laid, dug, cut, excavated, or otherwise prepared, hollow, soil, or otherwise, and so taken out, washed, dredged, sold and disposed of the same, or any part or parts thereof.

Also to acquire by purchase, or in any lawful manner and to sell, lease, convey, mortgage, or pledge, property of every kind and description, whether real, personal or mixed.

Also to engage in the business of mining gold, silver, and other precious metals of any kind or in the business of mining iron or coal or other mineral substances, and buying, selling, and dealing in the same; also to carry on the business of loading and unloading in all its branches, to construct, maintain and operate, manage and buy, sell and deal in all kinds of timber and lumber and in every line of business incident to the general transportation and trading of lumber business.

Also to make and carry into effect any arrangement for any union of stock, property, and interests, or for the consolidation or amalgamation of either or the whole or in part, with any company or proprietor, association or associations, partnerships, person or persons having any object or objects similar to or allied with this Company; and to purchase, run, equip, maintain, operate, and dispose of other railroads and telegraph lines, steamship lines, or manufacturing lines, properties having objects similar to or allied with the objects of this Company.

Also to perform all other acts and things corporate, incidental, or conducive to the attainment of the foregoing objects and purposes, or any of them.

#### Article Third.

The place where the principal business of this Company is to be transacted is at Sioux City in the

State of Iowa.

#### Article Fourth.

The term for which this corporation is to exist is

fifty years from and after its incorporation.

#### Article Sixth.

The number of directors of this corporation is five and the names and addresses of those who are appointed for the first year are, G. F. Stephens residing at Wallace, in said State; E. W. Gilbert residing at Coeur de Alene City, in said State; John ~~John~~ Dorsey residing at Coeur de Alene City, in said State; C. L. Precent residing at the city of Portland in the State of Oregon and J. L. Mitchell Jr., residing at the city of Lewiston, in the State of Washington all of said officers being citizens of the United States and a majority of them citizens and actual bona fide residents within said State of Idaho.

#### Article Sixth.

The amount of the capital stock of this Company is three million (\$3,000,000) dollars divided into thirty thousand (30,000) shares of the par value of one hundred (\$100) dollars.

#### Article Seventh.

The amount of said capital stock which has been actually subscribed is three million dollars, \$3,000,000, which has been subscribed by the following persons, to-wit, G. F. Stephens, of Wallace, Idaho, who subscribed for one share, E. W. Gilbert of Coeur de Alene City who subscribed for one share, John ~~John~~ Dorsey of Coeur de Alene City who subscribed for one share, C. L. Precent of the city of Portland, in the State of Oregon, who subscribed for 14,000 1/2 shares and J. L. Mitchell Jr., of the city of Lewiston, in the State

22 and 23, being held and contested for 14,000 Job shares.

The estimated length of the railroad and telegraph lines to be constructed is one hundred and fifty miles.

Article III. B.

The President of the company is G. A. Merchant, of the city of Portland, in the state of Oregon, the Vice-President is J. W. Gilbert, <sup>Residing</sup> in the city of Anchorage, Alaska, and the Secretary is F. G. Pendleton, in the city of Anchorage, Alaska, in the State of Alaska, and the Treasurer George A. Walker of the city of New York in the State of New York.






