#### ARTICLE I

Name, Status, and Office

Name. The name of this organization shall be Christian Boxers Outreach, Inc. (CBO), hereinafter referred to as the Corporation.

Status. The Corporation shall be a religious and non-profit organization in accordance with the laws of Idaho, and section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Office. The initial registered office of the Corporation in the state of Idaho shall be located at 1751 Ridgecrest Dr., Boise, 83712; address of Jim Baxter, incorporator and initial registered agent at that office.

#### ARTICLE II

#### Purposes

Purposes. The Corporation shall be organized exclusively for the purposes of glorifying God and "Introducing the boxing community to the all-time, undisputed, undefeated champion - Jesus Christ;" and to foster, develop, promote, and coordinate recreational and competitive amateur boxing opportunities for all USA Boxing member athletes and supportive participants.

## ARTICLE III

# Programs and Authorization

Programs. The Corporation shall include, but not be limited to, the following programs:

- (a) CBO Boxing Clubs. Boxing clubs committed to developing individual boxing skills, and providing Christian training and fellowship.
- (b) CBO Chapel Services. Chapel services conducted on Sunday

mornings in conjunction with sanctioned USA Boxing shows and tournaments.

- (c) Annual CBO Advancing Boxing Tournaments. Local, regional, and national competition open and available to all registered athlete and non-athlete members in good standing with USA Boxing. All tournaments shall feature an intermission where Christian boxers share their personal testimonies.
- (d) CBO Boxing/Bible Camps. Annual summer camps featuring boxing and Bible instruction, recreation, and Christian fellowship.
- (e) CBO coaching/Leadership Clinics. Clinics designed to equip CBO boxing coaches for implementing CBO's programs.

Authorization. The Corporation shall agree to abide by all official rules, regulations and policies of USA Boxing, Inc.; the National Governing Body of amateur boxing in the United States by Public Law 95-606, the 1978 Amateur Sports Act.

#### ARTICLE IV

# Directors and Officers

Directors. The names and addresses of those individuals who are to serve as the initial directors of the Corporation are as follows:

Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, an Executive Director, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

#### ARTICLE V

### Membership

Membership. The members of the Corporation shall consist of:

- (a) Club members. Boxing clubs who apply and are approved by CBO's Board of Directors, and are registered within territorial committees designed by USA Boxing to administrate boxing programs throughout the United States.
- (b) Individual members. Boxers, coaches, officials, and other individuals actively involved in boxing, and who profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### Dissolution

Dissolution. If deemed advisable by the Board of Directors, the Corporation my be dissolved pursuant to the provisions of the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation, or for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding sections of any future federal tax code.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### Finacial

Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall commence on the first day of July, and end on the last day of June in each year.

Individual benefit. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof.

#### ARTICLE VIII

# Political Activity and Lobbying

Political Activity and Lobbying. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
