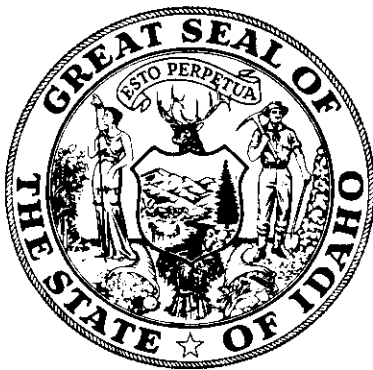

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
GROPP'S ELECTRIC, INCORPORATED

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Idaho Business Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is GROPP'S ELECTRIC, INCORPORATED.

SECOND: The period of its duration is perpetual.


THIRD: The purposes for which the corporation is organized are to transact the business of electrical contracting, and any or all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the Idaho Business Corporation Act.

FOURTH: The aggregate number of shares which the corporation shall have authority to issue is FIFTY-THOUSAND (50,000) shares, of a par value of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) per share.

FIFTH: The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 312 South Washington, Moscow, Idaho 83843, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is ARTHUR W. GROPP.

SIXTH: The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors of the corporation is one, and the name and address of the person who is to serve as director is ARTHUR W. GROPP, 1008 East 7th Street, Moscow, Idaho 83843.
