Articles of Incorporation
Article 2

Article 2: The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

- (A) This body is organized as a church exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), including, but not limited to, for such purposes, the establishing and maintaining of religious worship, the building, maintaining and operating of churches, parsonages, schools, chapels, radio stations, television stations, other media communications, book stores, rescue missions, print shops, child care centers, orphanages, camps, nursing homes, retreat centers, and any other ministry that the Church may be led of God to establish.
- (B) The church shall also ordain and license men to the Gospel ministry; evangelize the unsaved by proclaiming the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ; educate believers in a manner consistent with the requirements of Holy Scripture; and engage in any other ministry that the Church may decide, from time to time, to pursue in obedience to the will of God.

Articles of Incorporation
Article 8

Article 8: Upon dissolution the assets shall be distributed:

Upon dissolution of the church, the Board of Pastors/Elders shall, after paying or making provision for payment of all the liabilities of the Church, dispose of all of the assets of the Church to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Pastors/Elders shall determine. Assets may be distributed only to organizations that agree with the Church's Statement of Faith.
