# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

#### OF

# INTERMOUNTAIN FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL, INC.

The undersigned, acting as incorporators under the Idaho Non-Profit Corporation

Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

### ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is Intermountain Fair Housing Council, Inc.

## **ARTICLE II**

The corporation is organized as a non-profit corporation.

### ARTICLE III

The period of duration is perpetual.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

The purpose for which this corporation is organized is exclusively charitable as defined by Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future Internal Revenue Code), notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by an organization contributions to which are deductible under section 701(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the

corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law); the charitable purpose will consist of the following:

- 1. To promote the principles of fair housing in Idaho and surrounding regions/states and ensure that all residents have fair and equal access to housing.
  - 2. To provide advice, counseling, testing and investigation services, and legal representation to victims of housing discrimination.
  - 3. To increase public awareness and appreciation for the need to combat housing discrimination and promote open communities, through the provision of community education and training services, and the promotion of media coverage of fair housing issues.
  - 4. To encourage a consensus and cooperative effort on the part of housing providers, realtors, banks and mortgage companies to eliminate housing discrimination.
  - 5. To increase the ability of the private bar to recognize and respond effectively to housing discrimination cases, to further the goal of eliminating housing discrimination in the state.
  - 6. To serve as a clearinghouse for both housing providers/lenders and housing consumers for information concerning fair housing rights and obligations.
  - 7. To raise money and seek donations to assist the charitable objectives of the Idaho Fair Housing Council, Inc.
  - 8. To enter into contracts consistent with the charitable objectives of the Idaho Fair Housing Council, Inc.

#### ARTICLE V

The corporation shall have one (1) class of members. Members shall consist of individuals, private or community based organizations, or governmental

agencies who participate in activities sponsored by the corporation and who are interested in issues regarding advocacy efforts to eliminate housing discrimination and promote equal housing opportunities for individuals and families in Idaho and who support the purposes of the corporation. The number and qualifications of the members shall be further enumerated in the By-Laws of the corporation.

### ARTICLE VI

Membership in the corporation shall not be represented by the capital stock or certificates of membership.

#### ARTICLE VII

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the members shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of its assets to federal, state or local government for a public purpose or to other charitable organizations which qualify as tax exempt organizations pursuant to Section 502(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future Internal Revenue Code), as the members shall determine.
