and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Non-Profit Cooperative Associations as provided in Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, Blaine K. Tidwell, Filer, Idaho, Roxann Tidwell, Filer, Idaho, William L. Nungester, Buhl, Idaho, Arlo Wilson, Buhl, Idaho, and Eileen Wilson, of Buhl, Idaho, all being residents and natural persons of the age of 21 years or more and citizens of the State of Idaho and the United States of America, acting as incorporators of a corporation formed under and pursuant to the provisions of Title 30, Chapter 10 of the Idaho Code, do hereby adopt and execute the following articles of incorporation and do hereby certify and declare:

ARTICLE I.

That the name of said corporation is and shall be "NATIONAL AUTOMOBILE CLUB, INC."

ARTICLE II.

The purposes for which this corporation is formed and operated are including, but not limited to:

- (a) Establish, maintain and conduct an association or club composed primarily of owners and operators of motor vehicles and motor powered farm vehicles;
- (b) Maintain as an agent of the members of such automobile club or association a service organization to, or procuring for, members of such association or automobile club, any and all services which may be designated for the protection, aid, comfort, safety and convenience of such members;

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(c) To endeavor to do all things necessary to promote the interests and welfare of the members of such association or automobile club and to encourage safe, convenient, pleasureable and comfortable motor travel;

- (d) Prevent abuses in the use and operation of all types of self-propelled motor powered vehicles and to minimize road hazards and mishaps and ease their unfortunate effects;
- (e) Enhance the welfare of motorises and motoring generally;
- (f) Promote and encourage the construction, improvement and maintenance of improved highways;
- (g) Advocate the enactment of fair, just and equitable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, safety codes and pracices relating to the use of motor vehicles, and the rights and privileges of the owners and users thereof, and to encourage and assist in the proper enforcement of all such laws and regulations;
- (h) Affiliate, associate and cooperate with other and similar organizations, associations and clubs which have for their purposes the same or similar purposes as this club or association;
- (i) Assist and otherwise protect members, owners and operators of motor vehicles and other self-propelled power driven vehicles in their lawful and legal rights;
- (j) Assemble, prepare, publish and disseminate touring and travel information and to furnish information and advice to its members on any and all matters pertaining to or affecting their welfare, pleasure, safety, convenience and interests as motorists;

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- (k) Render aid, assistance, protection, guidance and services to its members while motoring and especially in times of distress and emergency;
- (1) To purchase, sell and otherwise deal in traveling and motoring aids, devices, guides and services, automobile accessories, parts and equipment of all types;
- (m) Maintain and operate automobile repair shops or service;
- (m) Maintain and operate service stations and deal in petroleum products and all other things normally incident to the operation of a service station or repair shop;
- (0) Deal in automobiles and other motorized equipment, either new or used;
- (p) Establish a central office and such subsidiary or branch offices or agencies as are or may become necessary, advisable, convenient or desirable to more fully serve the members and carry out the purposes of this association or club;
- or otherwise, and to own, develop, explore, exploit, improve, operate, lease, enjoy, control, manage or otherwise turn to account and to mortgage, grant, sell, assign, exchange, convey or otherwise dispose of, in any country, state, locality, territory or dependents of the United States or any other country, any and all real estate, lands, options, concessions, grants, land patents, franchises, rights, privileges, easements, tenements, estates, hereditaments, interest, chattels and properties or property rights of every description and nature whatsoever which the club

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or association may deem wise, proper, necessary or convenient for the conduct and operation of the affairs of the association or club.

- (r) Borrow or raise money, from time to time, and without limit, and upon any terms, in furtherance of any of the purpose of the club or association; to authorize the issuance of notes and other obligations or evidences of indebtedness of the club or association for moneys so borrowed; and to secure the payment of the same and of the interest thereon by mortgage upon, or pledge, conveyance, or assignment in trust of, the whole or any part of the property, real or personal, of the association or club, and whether at the time owned or thereafter acquired;
- (s) Enter into, make, execute, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and nature with any person, firm, association or corporation, which may be deemed necessary, advisable or convenient for the purpose of carrying out or furthering any of the above objects and purposes;
- (t) Arrange with any person, firm or corporation, the management of any of the business and affairs of the corporation for and on behalf of this association;
- (u) Secure, re-purchase and hold shares of its membership certificates and of the capital stock of any other corporation;
- (v) Arrange with any other person, firm or corporation to furnish to the members of this automobile club any benefit, advantage or service, which this association shall be authorized to furnish to its members;

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(w) Do each and all things set forth herein to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do in the State of Idaho, and in any other state, country or place;

The foregoing clauses shall be construed as objects, purposes and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that any enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this association or club.

ARTICLE III.

In no event shall any income or assets of this corporaion be distributed to or inure to the benefit of any member,
director, or officer of this corporation, either directly or
indirectly, other than as bona fide expenses in carrying out the
directions and authorities of the Board of Directors and officers
hereof in carrying out the purposes of the automobile club. In
the event of the termination, liquidation or dissolution of this
corporation for any reason, all of the assets thereof shall be
distributed to another corporation holding a certificate of
exemption from the United States Treasury or to such public
organization devoted exclusively to charitable and educational
ends.

ARTICLE IV.

This corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE V.

The location and post office address of the registered office of this corporation is the National Automobile Club, Inc., P. O. Box 1292, Twin Falls, Idaho.

ARTICLE VI.

There shall be no capital stock of this corporation,

but there shall be issued membership cards to each member hereof.

which cards cannot be assigned so that the transferee thereof

can become a member of this automobile clug, except by approval

of the Board of Directors and under such regulations as the by
laws may prescribe. The rights and interests of all members in

this corporation shall be equal, and no member can have or acquire

a greater interest than any other member. Members with dues in

good standing are entitled to a membership card for the current

year.

ARTICLE VII.

ARTICLE VIII.

The private property of any member of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever, and the membership card shall not be subject to assessment for any purpose of paying expenses, conducting business or paying debts of the automobile club.

ARTICLE IX.

The number of directors of the automobile club shall be specified in the by-laws and such number may, from time to time be increased or decreased in such manner as may be prescribed in the by-laws, provided that the number of directors shall not be less than five (5). The officers of the automobile club shall be elected at the annual meeting of the automobile club as provided by the by-laws.

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ARTICLE X.

The Board of Directors is expressly authorized to repeal and amend the By-Laws of the corporation and to adopt new By-Laws as provided therein.

ARTICLE XI.

The jurisdictional limits of this corporation shall be world-wide and offices may be maintained and directors or stockholders meetings may be held at any place.

ARTICLE XII.

The authorized number and qualification of members of this corporation, the different classes of membership, if any, voting and other rights and privileges of each class of membership, and the liability of each and all classes of members for dues and assessments, if any, and the methodof collection thereof shall be set forth in the By-Laws of the corporation.
