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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE INCORPORATED CENTER OF RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of a nonprofit corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Corporation") under the Idaho Business Corporation Act (the "Act"), adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such Corporation:

ARTICLE I, NAME

The name of the Corporation is, THE INCORPORATED CENTER OF RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

ARTICLE II, PERIOD OF DURATION

The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III, PURPOSES AND POWERS

SECTION 1. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and religious purposes within the meanings of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Code.

SECTION 2. The specific and primary purpose for which the corporation is intending to initially engage in is to research and develop comprehensive Truth from within one's Center.

- a. To teach constant seeking of the fulfillment of the purpose of life.
- b. To teach Health, Fitness, and Balance.
- c. To conduct and maintain, supervise and establish schools, classes or training conferences to fulfill the purposes of this Corporation.
- d. To print, record, publish, buy, sell, and manufacture books, magazines, maps, blue-prints, pamphlets, newspapers, newsletters, electronic recordings, and transcriptions, to

sell and solicit advertizing, and to buy, rent, or lease any real and personal property, or engage in any business to accomplish this end, and purposes of this Corporation.

- e. To start new Center Stations throughout the United States of America, or anywhere in the world, and to acquire, purchase, rent, lease, or maintain any real or personal property to achieve that end.
- f. To help and visit the poor and afflicted, and to give spiritual and material aid to the needy, as far as the finances of the Corporation permits.
- g. To bestow orders, licenses and ordain competent persons and to issue certificates for the work of ministry, and confer the honorary degrees of Doctor of Divinity, Doctor of Literature, and Doctor of Letters upon those persons, who in the judgement of the Board of Directors are competent, qualified, and deserving.
- h. To train, commission, and finance the ministries engaged in the accomplishing of the purposes of this Corporation.

SECTION 3. The corporation shall have all the powers granted by law necessary and proper to carry out its above-stated purposes. However, the powers of the corporation shall be limited to those permitted to an organization which is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, nor shall the corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, carry on any activities which would remove the said tax benefits.

ARTICLE IV, MEMBERS

This corporation shall have members. A written request to become a member must be submitted to and approved by the Board of Directors.

A member must contribute an ingredient that allows them to function as a Centered person. Members shall have the rights to meet and give recommendations to the Board of Directors, but the final management decisions are vested with the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V, REGISTERED AGENT & OFFICE

The initial registered agent of the corporation shall be Dawn P. Haskins.

The initial registered office of the corporation shall be:

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation shall be set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V, BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The number of Directors of the Corporation shall be as specified in the Bylaws. The number of Directors constituting the initial Board of Directors of the corporation is 3 (three) and the names and addresses of these persons who are to serve as initial Directors are:

The authority to make Bylaws for the corporation is hereby vested in the Board of Directors and they may change and amend such Bylaws so long as they do not conflict with the provisions of these Articles or with the regulatory agreement.

The existing Directors will elect successor Directors.

The corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation in the name now or hereafter prescribed by statute.

This corporation is not organized for profit, and its assets and monies shall not be used for the private profit of any individual.

Upon liquidation or dissolution of this corporation, its property and assets shall be distributed and disbursed for purposes and objects set forth in these Articles of Incorporation to any organization or organizations selected by the Directors which is qualified as exempt under the provisions of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or any successor statute and regulations thereof, as presently existing or as may be hereafter amended.
