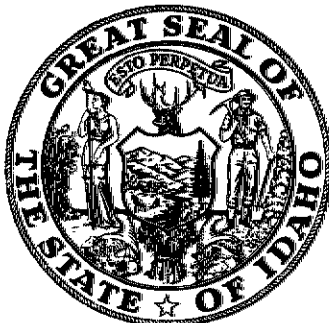

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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1. The name of the corporation is Everlasting Covenant Ministries, Inc.
2. This corporation is a non-profit corporation.
3. The period of duration is perpetual.
4. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is set forth below:
 - To be a dynamic spiritual organism empowered by the Holy Spirit to share Christ with as many people as possible in our church, community, and throughout the world.
 - To be a worshipping fellowship, experiencing an awareness of God, recognizing His person, and responding in obedience to His leadership.
 - To experience an increasing meaningful fellowship with God and fellow believers.
 - To help people experience a growing knowledge of God and man.
 - To be a church which ministers unselfishly to persons in the community and the world in Jesus' name.
 - To be a church whose purpose is to be Christlike in our daily living by emphasizing total commitment of life personality, and possessions to the lordship of Christ.
5. The non-profit corporation is to have a non-voting membership. The name and address is: Everlasting Covenant Ministries, Inc., 201 Washington Street South, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301. The ruling board of Pastor and Elders has the authority to elect Trustees and Officers.
6. The ruling board of Pastor and Elders will retain unto itself the exclusive right of self-government in all phases of the spiritual and temporal life of the church. This fellowship is an interdenominational group of believers in Jesus Christ.

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7. Discipline: It shall be the practice of this church to emphasize to its members that every reasonable measure will be taken to assist any troubled member. The pastor, the elders, and other members of the church staff, are available for counsel and guidance. The attitude of members toward one another shall be guided by a concern for redemption rather than punishment.


Should some serious condition exist which would cause a member to become a liability to the general welfare of the church, the pastor and elders will take every reasonable measure to resolve the problem in accord with Matthew 18:15-17. If it becomes necessary for the church to take action to exclude any member, a majority vote of pastor and elders is required and the church may proceed to declare the person to be no longer in the membership of the church. All such proceedings shall be pervaded by a spirit of Christian kindness and forbearance.

The church may restore to membership any person previously excluded, upon request of the excluded person, and by vote of the pastor and elders upon evidence of excluded person's repentance and reformation.

8. The street address of the initial registered office is 201 Washington Street South, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301. The registered agent is James Paul Mace, Jr. James Paul Mace, Jr., the Pastor of Everlasting Covenant Ministries is the incorporator.
