EXHIBIT A TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF MILES 4 MINDS, INC.

Article 2. The Purpose for which the corporation is organized is exclusively for Charitable and Educational purposes including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time.

The corporation is to accomplish its purposes by promoting educational equality and enrichment efforts, particularly targeting underprivileged youth: (i) actively increasing awareness and participation to serve youth education in the community; (ii) educating the community, regarding underserved youth education; (iii) promoting the interests of educational causes in need of support; and (iv) fostering community involvement and support in the education of underserved youth.

No part of the corporation's income is to be devoted to other than charitable, educational or literary uses or purposes. No part of net earnings or assets of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its directors, officers, or other private persons except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article 2.
