ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

BHW, INC.

The undersigned, being over 18 years of age and a citizen of the United States of America, hereby forms the following corporation pursuant to the Idaho Business Corporation Act.

FIRST: The name of the corporation is BHW, Inc.

SECOND: The period of its duration is perpetual.

THIRD: The purpose for which the corporation is organized is to engage in the business of retail and wholesale tire sales and service, automobile repair and any other business not prohibited by law.

FOURTH: The aggregate number of shares which the corporation shall have authority to issue is 50,000 shares, all one class, and of a \$1.00 par value.
