THE UNION CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF BUFFALO

We, the undersigned, all being persons of full age, and citizens of the United States and residents of the City of Buffalo, County of Johnson, State of Wyoming, desiring to associate ourselves and continue of free church pursuant to the laws of the State of Wyoming, hereby certify as follows:

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The corporate name and title of said corporation shall be:

"THE UNION CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF BUFFALO"

II.

The objects and purposes of the corporation shall be for the maintenance and promotion of religious worship with the power necessary and incidental to own, maintain, acquire, sell real and personal property and make such other transfers within or without the State of Wyoming as may be proper and necessary for its objects and purposes.

III.

The principal office of said corporation shall be 110 Bennett Street, in the City of Buffalo, County of Johnson, State of Wyoming; and Robert W. McBride shall be designated as the Resident Agent of said church corporation for all purposes as may be required by the laws of the State of Wyoming, his address is 110 Bennett Street, Buffalo, Wyoming.

IV.

The term of existence of said corporation shall be perpetual.

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The affairs of said corporation shall be managed and controlled by a Board of Trustees consisting of seven (7)

members, and they shall be elected to and hold their offices for such terms as may be provided by the by-laws of said corporation; and the insorporators and trustees for the first year of its existence shall be:

- (a) William W. Campbell
- (b) Richard Reimann
- (c) Suzanne Knepper
- (d) Irene Mader
- (e) Warren Atter
- (f) Alvin Johnson

VI.

The Board of Trustees shall have power to do, manage and control the affairs of said corporation as may be provided in the by-laws, not inconsistent with the laws of the State of Wyoming; and, the members of said church corporation shall have power at all times to make such prudent by-laws as they shall deem proper and advisable for the management of said corporation.

VII.

In the event of dissolution, all debts and obligations of every kind shall first be paid, and the Trustees shall then have the power in their discretion to convert the remaining assets to cash if they deem this action to be expedient. The cash so realized or the remaining physical assets shall than be given or conveyed to a non-profit religious or charitable institution or foundation as may be determined by the membership of said church corporation at special meeting convened for that purpose.
