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Article III:

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.

Article IV:

The corporation is organized exclusively for religious, charitable, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, including, but not limited to maintaining and operating an academy, tutorial, and adult and special needs education center for the purpose of obtaining assistance or attaining a diploma.

Article V:

The street address of the registered office of the corporation is 1111 So. Orchard Suite # 253 Boise, ID 83705; and the name of the registered agent located at such address is Stephen I. Blackburn, Principal/Administrator. \$

Article VI:

The corporation will not have members. All decisions will be made by the board of directors.

Article VII:

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the board of directors. The number of the directors shall not exceed twelve (12), but may not be less than three (3).

Article VIII:

The names and addresses of the persons serving on the initial board of directors are as follows.

Article IX:

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the ministry shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the tax-exempt purposes of the ministry set forth in Article IV.

Article X:

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign in behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Article XI:

The corporation shall have a racially nondiscriminatory policy and therefore shall not discriminate against applicants, students, employees, and others on the basis of race, color, or national or ethnic origin.

Article XII:

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, transfer all assets to a fund, foundation, or organization which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, or educational purposes and that time qualifies as an organization exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

Article XIII:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) or the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue United States Internal Revenue Law).
