is duly recorded on Film No. **114** of Record of Domestic Corporations, of the State
of Idaho, and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Section 30-103 and
Sections 30-1001 to 30-1005, inclusive, Idaho Code.

successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name hereinbefore stated, for
perpetual existence from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at
Cottonwood in the County of **Idaho.**

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

THE COTTONWOOD ROD AND GUN CLUB, INC.
A Nonprofit cooperative association

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, being citizens of the State of Idaho and of the United States of America, and all being over the age of 21 years, hereby associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit cooperative association, under and by virtue of Title 30 Chapter 10 of the Idaho Code, and do hereby adopt the following articles of incorporation for said organization:

I.

That the name of said Association shall be:

' THE COTTONWOOD ROD AND GUN CLUB, INC. '

II.

That the term and existence of this Association shall be perpetual.

III.

That the main office of this Association shall be Cottonwood, County of Idaho, State of Idaho.

IV.

The purpose for which this association and the reasons for which it is formed are as follows:

1. For the protection of fish and other game, for the cultivation of the arts of sportsmen with rod and gun, the buying and acquiring of land on which to erect buildings and for the location and places to shoot, and for the mutual social enjoyment of its members.

2. To sell materials, guns, rods, and other akin materials which are necessary and/or proper in the operation of such an organization and association. To conduct contests of every kind and character which is akin to and proper in the operation of such an association.

3. To promote, encourage and to establish a sound program of public education and for the increasing safety in hunting and shooting

To promote, encourage and establish a sound program for public education concerning the specific problems of sportsmen and for the preservation and control of game and birds within the State of Idaho.

5. To promote and bring together all persons within the State and to coordinate their interests with a view to obtain a more fuller understanding of the problems of sportsmen.

6. To appoint officers and representatives to conduct any or all of the operations of the business of the organization as it relates to the harmonious cooperation with other clubs within and without the State.

7. To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description and for any lawful purpose, but not for profit or gain of the membership or association, and with any person, firm or corporation, town, City, government or any dependency. To raise funds by subscription or dues from the members and other interest persons and for the purpose of facilitation of the uses of this organization. V.

V.

That said membership shall elect annually or at other specified times officer and board of directors for the operation of said association.

VI.

To appoint certain of its members for the purpose of signing and endorsing all negotiable paper appertaining to said association.

VII.

To designate two or more of its members to constitute an executive committee, which shall for the time being, as provided in said resolution or in the by-laws of the association have an exercise any or all of the powers of the board of directors in the management of this association.

VIII.

This association may in its by laws confer upon its directors in addition to the normal powers of the board of directors any additional powers and authority that it may deem expedient and necessary for the proper operation of the association.

IX.

The interest of all members shall be equal, and no member shall have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member. Such association shall not issue capitol stock, but

but shall issue membership certificates to each member thereof, which certificate cannot be assigned, so that the transferee can by any such transfer become a member of the association. A certificate of membership, signed by the President and Secretary, shall be issued to each member and such certificate shall not be assignable, but shall be returned to the corporation on the death, resignation, or removal of any member when any such member shall become ineligible to membership herein. No member shall have any right, title or interest in any of the assets of this corporation, and upon loss of membership such person shall have no claim against the corporation or association for any of the assets of the association or the value thereof. In the event of voluntary dissolution of the association the assets shall become the property of the members at the time in good standing in the association.

X.

The board of directors are hereby granted the power to waive any or all of the fees to any person for the performance of services to the association.

XI.

The private property of the members shall not be subject to the payment of the association debts to any extent or in any amount whatsoever.

XII.

This association shall not engage in business for pecuniary profit whatsoever.

XIII.

This association reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provisions herein contained in this Article of Incorporation, in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute and all rights conferred upon the certificate holder herein granted, subject to this reservation.

XIV.

The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of Five (5) members, elected at each annual meeting of the membership of this corporation

each of whom shall serve for a period of one year, or until their successors have been elected and qualified.
